TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF FRANKLIN COUNTY, GENTLEMEN - I certify that in pursuance of your order I proceeded on the 17th Inst. (Dec.) to survey and make out a route for a County Road as follows (Vis.)

Commenced near the house of Justin Denton at a point where a County Road of Delaware intersects the line between this and Delaware County, thence S 29° and 15' ~~west~~ 380 poles to the main Road leading from Worthington northward at the line dividing the tracts of land owned by Wm. Thompson and Buckely Campbell respectfully the aforesaid is a correct plat of same.
