(ALUM CREEK DR.)

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On the petition of John Wallace and others for a Road leading down Alum Creek on the west side as follows. To commence at the old ford of said creek above David Nelson's thence to run southerly down Alum creek to the cross road near John White, Senior, thence southwardly to William Mooberry's farm, thence southwardly on or near the line between the 21 & 22 Ranges to the ford on Big Belly Creek at the point where the road from Columbus to New Lancaster crosses said creek.

Ordered that Wm. Stewart, Michael Fishers and George W. William the appointed Viewers and Abiather V. Taylor- Surveyor of the above road and that they meet at the office of W.C. King in Columbus on the 3rd Monday December next and after being duly sworn as the law directs proceed to View and survey said road and make return thereof at our next meeting Nov. 25, 1817.

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Nelson Road - from Livingston Avenue to E Broad Street

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On the return of a Road petition by John Wallace and others and returns by Michael Fisher, William Stewart, and George W. Williams, Viewers, and Abiather V. Taylor, surveyor, as follows. Beginning at the old ford on Alum Creek above David Nelson's and ending at the ford on Big Belly creek on the new Lancaster road making John White's and William Mooberry points on the said Road. S 29 E 20 S 10 W 13 over the prairie S 22 E 20 P. S 6 E 75 to the 3 mile tree S 6 E 50 poles S 22 E 114, S 32 E 80 to a beech tree where the roads meet S 20 E 32 P. S 38 E 36 P. S 45 E 8 poles to the 4 mile tree, S 33 E 12 po. to the big hollow S 4 W 24 P. to Mooberry's house S 51 E 28 to the range line, thence south 68 poles to the 5 mile tree, S 320 to the 6 mile tree, S 42 E 26 P. S 20 E 28 P. S 20 E 54 P. to the 7 mile tree, S 212 P. S 48 P. S 45 W 90 po. S 10 W 80 P. S 26 poles S 12 E 50 to the road leading Columbus to new Lancaster.

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EDWARD LIVINGSTON PETITION FOR DAMAGES.
(ALUM CREEK DRIVE)

On the petition of Edward Livingston for damages as follows.

Gen. In consequence of a road having lately been reported running at fording as the State road above the residence of David Nelson making John White a point in said road and terminating at Sharp's Mill. Reported on the petition of Wallace and others, your petitioner feels himself much injured by the circuitous route in which the Viewers carried said road to the damage of your petitioner by meandering in a diagonal direction through the land of your petitioner. Therefore prays that your honorable body appoint Viewers to assess the damage, that will accrue to your petitioner, should said road be established.

It is therefore ordered that Michael Patton, John McElvain, James Kooker, Samuel Gillette and John Shields be and they are hereby appointed Viewers, to assess the damage on the above road if any there be, and that they meet at the house of Eli C. King Esq. on the 10th day November next and after being duly sworn as the law directs, proceed to view said road and assess the damage if any there be and make report thereof at the next regular meeting of the Commissioners of the County.
