

Riverside Drive - from the area of Fishinger Road to south of Henderson Road

ROAD RECORD NO. 5

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( COLS. & MARYSVILLE )

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On the return of a View of a Road petitioned for by Jacob Grey and others as follows, returned by Hector Kilbourne surveyor Joseph Smart and Harold Walcutt and High Fulton, Viewers, on the east bank of the Scioto River at a run known by the name of Spring Run where the County Road crosses said river, thence north 29 west 18 poles, thence north 6 W 336 poles, thence N 21 18 poles, thence N 18 W 72 poles, thence N 9 West 168 P, thence N 52 poles, thence N 18 W 20 poles, thence N 14 W 68 P. to a large oak tree near Marion's north line so called making in the whole a distance of two miles one hundred eighty two poles, reported of public and private utility. Ordered of record and to be opened thirty feet wide. This March 10th, 1818.

Whereupon William Armstrong produced to the Board of Commissioners of Franklin County " In consequence of a Road having been laid out by your order through my land to-wit by Mrs. Hugh Fulton, Joseph Smart, Harold Walcutt, Viewers, and Hector Kilbourne, surveyor, I feel myself damaged in property to a great amount, therefore pray that you will grant me a review for damages as far as said Road passes through your petition, land according to the statute in such case made and provided N. 25, 1807.

Signed, WILLIAM ARMSTRONG.

Ordered that Jacob Grubb, George Skidmore, William Domigan, David Jameson and Lucas Sullivant be appointed assessors of damages on the above Road meet at the house of Jacob Kellar Esq. in Franklinton on the 3rd Monday December next and after being duly qualified proceed to View said Road and if said Viewer should find by making some alteration on said Road where it passes through the said Armstrong land so as to lessen the expense of the County, they are hereby ordered so as to do.
