This day to-wit: 5th day December, 1817, James Carpenter and Benjamin J. Martin, filed in this office the following plat of a State Road leading from Wooster in Wain County to Columbus in Franklin County, State Of Ohio, who were sworn to the same as Road Commissioners appointed by the legislature of the State aforesaid for the purpose of laying out said Road- have reported the following a correct survey so far as it runs through Franklin County.

Beginning at the North line of Franklin County, thence South one hundred poles, South Twenty, East five hundred and forty S 3-1/2 E377 South 12 W 56, #96 W 50 S 3 W 320 S 10 W 160, S 17 W 30, S 34 W 50, S 20 W 60, S 39 79-280, 100 S 34 W 80, S43 W20, S25 W220, S200 20 S15 W 74, S16 E126-82, S 20 W 140 S 25 W 80, S 40 W 54, S 15 W 46, 43 mile tree, S 27 W 60, S33 W 260. S 26 84 miles S28 W 488 , 85 miles S 120 86 tree Columbus.

We do certify the above is the plated draft of a State Road laid out from Wooster to Columbus so far as it runs in Franklin County making a distance of 12 miles 260 perches. We our hand this 18th day of September, 1817.

Where upon William Marshall presented the following memorial to-wit on the 6th day of Dec. 1817.

To The Commissioners of Franklin County now sitting the petition of William Marshall humbly showeth that in consequence of laying out a State Road leading from Columbus to Wooster which road runs part way through his land. He feels himself agrieved and prays your Board to appoint five freeholders to assess the damages. Dec. 6, 1817.

Therefore it is ordered that Thomas Moor, Joseph Hunter, Robert Armstrong, George Skidmore and John Brickel be appointed Viewers of the aforesaid Road and that they meet at the house of Eli King in Columbus on the 8th day of January next and after being duly sworn as the law directs proceed to View said Road and ascertain the damage if any and make report thereof at the next session of the Commissioners of Franklin County. December 22nd, 1817.

Also on the 20th Inst John Starr presented the following memorial.

To the Honorable, the Commissioners of Franklin County. The petition of John Starr, a Citizen of said County humbly showeth that a State Road should be laid out of Wooster to Columbus passing the land of said petitioner that from the course which it takes through the land of your petitioner he conceives himself unnessacarily injured, he therefore prays that five disinterested landholders may be appointed by your honorable Board to assess the damages he substained by said Road.

It is ordered that the foregoing View be and, hereby rejected on the following reasons. That the State Road leaving from Wooster to Columbus and running through William Marshall's and John Starr's land, the Commissioners having been informed that said Road was opened previous to their petition for damages. The Commissioners therefore are of opinion that agreeable to the section of law regulating roads and highways that said Starr and Marshall have lost their remedy.
