Beginning at the foot of a hill, nearly opposite McCoy's Mill, thence northwesterly until it intersects the spring branch near Hansin Perry where the old County Road crosses said branch, thence northwardly on the most convenient and best route until it intersects the said old County Road south of Moses Watt's Still house and also that such part of the late lain out road may be vacated as may be left out by the Viewers who are hereby appointed To wit: Viz. Joseph Hunter, George Skidmore, and John Brickel, Viewers, and John Shields surveyor and that they meet at McCoy's Mill the 1st day April and after being duly sworn proceed to View said Road and make return thereof at our next meeting, March 10, 1818.

Know All Men By These Presents, That we William Armstrong and John Armstrong are held firmly bound unto the treasurer of Franklin County, in the just and full sum of One Hundred Dollars, the payment of which well and truly to be made, We bind ourselves, our heirs, etc, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents. Witness our hands and seals the 10th day of March in the year of 1818.

The condition of the above obligation is such, that, Whereas, the above named William Armstrong hath this day, petitioned for an alteration and vacation of a road running through Norwich Township on the east side of the Scioto river as follows.

Beginning at the foot of the hill near McCoy's Mill, thence northwesterly until it intersects the spring branch near Mansen Perry's, where the old County road crosses said branch, thence northwardly on the most convenient and best route until it intersects the said, old County road south of Moses Watt's still house and also to vacate such part of the late laid out road as Viewer may think fit, now if the said William and John Armstrong shall well and truly pay all cost in case said road fails, then this obligation to, be void, otherwise to remain in full force in law.

Beginning near McCoy's Mill in the old road, thence N55 W 92 poles, thence N 45 W 40 poles, thence N 20 W 48 poles, thence N 55 W 32 poles, thence N 49 W 100 poles, thence 18 W 100 poles, thence N--100 poles, thence N 12 W 130 poles, thence N 5 W 40 poles, thence N--134 poles, thence N 10 W 70 poles, thence N--- 96, thence N 25 W 20 poles, thence N 12 W 60 poles.

To a large Beech near Watt's still house on the original road surveyed on the 1st and 2nd days of April 1818.

Viewd by us on the 1st and 2nd of April 1818.

Whereupon Ebenezer Richards and Jacob Guy presented a remonstrance to the above road and entered into bond; praying for a Review on the aforementioned road, it is therefore ordered that Robert Nelson, James Kookken, John Colet, John Cutver and Michael Patton be and they are hereby appointed to Review the before mentioned road, and that they meet at the house of Joseph Grate, Esq. on Friday the 28th day of this Inst., and after being duly sworn as the law directs proceed to Review said road, and make report thereof at the next regular meeting of the Commissioners of Franklin County, August 12, 1818
