On the petition of George Mitchell and others for a Road leading from John Sell's's tavern to meet a State Road near George Mitchell's as follows.

Beginning at John Sells Tavern leading from that point in a N.Westerly direction until it meets the end of the State Road already opened near George Mitchell's.

Ordered that Alexander Basset, Benjiman Britton and Daniel Brunk be appointed Viewers and John Shields surveyor for said Road and that they meet at the house of John Sells, Esq., on the 3rd day of April, 1818, and after being sworn shall proceed to View said Road and make report thereof at our next session March 11th, 1818.

Know all men by these presents, that we, George Mitchell and Ennis Devalt are held and firmly bound unto the Treasurer of Franklin County, in just and full sum of One Hundred dollars, the payment well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves, our heirs, etc, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents. Witness our hands and seals, 25th day of August in the year of 1817.

The condition of the above obligation is such whereas, the above bound George Mitchell have this laid in a petition for a road. Beginning at a point, where the State Road intersects the line of Franklin County in a direction towards John Sells, etc. Now that the said above bound George Mitchell shall well and truly pay all cost that may accrue on said Road in case the said petition fails, then this obligation to be void and of no effect, Otherwise to remain in full force in law.

The condition of the above obligation is such that, whereas, the above bound George Mitchell who has this day presented a petition for a road, to run from John Sells to Big Darby as follows: Beginning at John Sells' Tavern leading from there in a N. westerly direction until it meets the end of the State Road already opened near George Mitchell's, Now if the said George Mitchell and John Sells do well and truly pay all cost accruing on a View, etc, on said road in case said petition should fail then this obligation to be void and of no effect, otherwise to remain in full force in law.

Agreeable to an order issued for a View of a Road. Petitioned for by George Mitchell and others. Beginning at John Sell's house thence N 15 W 220 poles, thence N 68 W 355 poles, thence N 35 W 140 poles, thence N 60 W 80 poles, W 130 poles, thence N 80 W 40 poles, thence N 45 W 40 poles, thence N 80 W 40 poles, thence N 84 W 470 poles, thence N 57 W 101 poles, thence N 80 W 240 poles, thence S 77 W 480 poles to George Mitchell's, thence N 68 W 38 to the intersection of a road in the County line of Madison. Reported as follows: We the undersigned Viewers being legally notified to View a road leading from John Sell's on the Scioto to George Mitchell's on the waters of Darby are of opinion that if a road be opened and kept in repair agreeable to the afore said courses, that it will be of Public Utility.

Whereupon Charles Mitchell presented the following petition on the 11th day of August 1818. Viz. To the Honorable Board of Commissioners of Franklin County now sitting in their August Session, 1818. GENTLEMEN:- It is understood by the undersigned that the returns of a road from John Sells towards Darby, that has lately been Viewed Danile Brunk and Brunck and surveyed by John Shields is now before your Board to be proceeded on as required by law, and as that road passes through your petitioners land, in a direction contrary to his appropriation, he feels himself agrieved thereby, and considers his property will be materially injured by said road, should be established and opened where it is now laid and prays your Honorable Board to extend to him the provisions of the Act entitled an act for opening roads and highways, which embraces his case, your petitioner as in duty bound to pray, etc, August 11, 1818.

CHARLES MITCHELL.

It is therefore ordered that the following persons be and that they are hereby appointed to View the aforesaid road and assess the damage that the said Charles Mitchell may sustain in consequence of said road passing through his land; viz.

Thomas Bachus, Thomas Meckey, Robert Boid, Robert Eliot and Samuel Davis, and that they meet at the house of John Sells, Esq., on the 18th Sept. next, and after being sworn as the law directs proceed to View said road and make report thereof at the next regular meeting of the Commissioners of Franklin County, August 7, 1818.

It is therefore further ordered that the before appointed Viewers to wit Thomas Bachus, Robert Eliot, Thomas Meckey and Samuel Davis meet at the house of John Sells, Esq., on the 6th day of November next and after being sworn proceed to Review or re-examine the aforesaid road and examine the same and the ground through which said road is intended to run and if a majority of said Viewers should be of opinion that said road may be changed so as to lessen the damage without increasing the distance to much or in other respects to injure the public make report thereof at the next regular meeting of the Commissioners of Franklin County and it is further ordered that if in their opinion they think necessary call to their assistance a skillful surveyer.
