Whereas to-wit the 27th day of August, 1817, to-wit Charles Hunter, James Gardiner and Samuel Dyer Viewers made the following return of a road surveyed by P. McClen and petitioned for James Johnson and Samuel Kerr for an alteration of a road which leads up and down main Darby Viz. Beginning at a stake where the road crosses the a forked branch, running upward North fifty one West sixty six poles North thirty eight, West twenty poles, North twenty one, West one hundred and fifty poles, North thirty seven, West twenty eight poles, North sixty West one hundred and seventy six poles, to the intersection with the old road at from Chillicothe spring branch, the way the present road runs is one mile and one hundred and fifty poles, the alteration thus made is one mile and twenty poles, said Viewers reported said alteration to be of Public Utility.

Where upon John Turner appeared and entered notice of appeal, and entered into bond with John Edgar his security for the payment of cost.

Appeal rendered up November 24, 1818, and whereas Abraham J. McDowell hath this day presented the following certificate to-wit,
