Field notes of a State road from Columbus to Jacksonville in Fairfield County, Viz. That part which passes through Franklin County Commencing at the County line at the part of intersection from Jacksonville, thence North 71 W 280 4 mile tree passing Black Lick at 84 poles, thence N 71 W 132 P. a branch runs south 4 P. to the Bridge, same 320 P. 5 mile tree a Beech, same 320 poles 6 mile tree, a sugar tree in Thompson's field 30 P. Walnut creek 11 poles wide runs south a good 40 same 240 P. 6 poles to be bridged, same 320 P. 7 mile tree a Beech, same 312 P. branch runs south 25 links wide, same 320 P. 8 mile tree a Beech 32 poles branch runs S.W. same 320 P. 9 mile tree a Beech same 320 P. 10 mile tree a Beech, 32 poles a branch runs S.W. same 176 P. Alum creek 10 poles wide runs S. same 280 P. it intersecting the road passing by Whites, thence West 40 P. 11 mile tree same 320 P. 12 mile tree, same 320 P. 13 mile tree, same 280 P. intersects the south end of High -- Street in Columbus.

Surveyed by Joseph Vance and Abraham Peeks in September 18, 1818.

Ordered that the above road be of Record agreeable to the above courses and distances June 9th, 1819. And that the trustees through whose Township said Road may run be notified of the above order and that they open said road agreeable to law.

On the petition Edward Livingston, Jacob Russ, John White, and John Wallace praying for damage on the Jacksonville road commencing at the Town of Jacksonville in the County of Fairfield and terminating in the Town of Columbus in Franklin County and running through the lands of the aforesaid petitioners.

It is therefore ordered that Horace Walcut, William Domigan, Thomas Moor, Christian Howe & Michael Patton be appointed viewers on said road and that they meet at the house of William Long, Esq., in Columbus on the 6th day of September next and after being duly sworn as the law directs proceed to view said road or that part thereof which runs through the petitioners land and make report thereof at the next regular meeting of the Commissioners of Franklin County August 4, 1819.

REPORT OF DAMAGES ON THE ABOVE ROAD.

We the undersigned being called on by an order on the 6th day of September to view and assess the damages on a certain road called the Jacksonville road, Commencing at said Jacksonville and running to the Town of Columbus accordingly on the 6th day of September 1819 present Christian Howe and Michael Patton and postponed until the twentieth instant according to postponement all present being duly qualified proceeded to view and assess the damages on said road according to said order and estimate them as follows, through the land of Jacob Russ four hundred and eighty Dollars through the Land of Edward Livingston five hundred and fifty and through the lands of John White eighty-eight dollars.
