( CHAMBERS RD. &amp; N.W. BLVD. )

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On the petition of John McElvain and others for a road leading from Joseph Shrom to McCoys Mill as follows. Commencing at the highway or road leading from Franklinton to Worthington on the south line of Joseph Shrom's land intersects said road, thence west until it meets the line that divides the lands of John McElvain and William Domigan or as near as possible, thence west with said line, or as near the same, to west an thereof, thence in a direct line or as near as a good road may be laid westwardly so as to intersect the county road leading from Franklinton up the east side of Scioto river at or near McCoys Mill.

Ordered that George Skidmore, Samuel Henderson and Benjimen Sells be and they are hereby appointed viewers and Joseph Vance Surveyor on said road and that they meet at the house of John Hunter, Esq. on the 26th day of June 1819 and after being sworn as the law directs proceed to View and survey said road and make report thereof at the next regular meeting of the Commissioners of Franklin County June 18, 1819.

Whereas to-wit on the 23rd day June 1819, John McElvain one of the signers of the above petition having satisfied us that Joseph Vance who was appointed to survey the above route is at present indisposed and unable to perform said duty, It is therefore ordered that Jerimiah W. Lane be appointed in his staid and that the said Jerimiah Lane attend at the house of Eli C. King on the 29th instant and after being sworn as the law directs, proceed to survey said road and make report thereof at their next regular meeting June 28, 1819.

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On the return of a road petitioned for by John McElvain and Viewed by Samuel Henderson and Benjamin Sells and Surveyed by Jeremiah McLain who have returned as follows:

Beginning at a stake on the west side of the road leading from Franklinton to Worthington at the mouth of the land between the lands of Joseph Shrum & Andrew McElvain and running from thence west 88 poles to a corner in Shrum's lane thence N 74 west through said Shrum's land to a branch 77 poles, thence west to the end of and through the lane between John McElvain & William Domigan 121 poles to a stake and trees marked, on the line between the lands of said McElvain & Domigan, thence north 63° West 260 poles to the ditch dug by Thomas Bachus, thence north 77 West 440 poles to a Black Haar on the side hill east of the road running up the east side of the Scioto river and opposite the end of the road leading down the hill to the mill, late the property of Thomas Bachus but now of McCoy. Making the whole distance 3 miles and twenty poles.
