On the petition of William Armstrong and others for a View of a road and vacation of part of a road, on the east side of the the East Scioto river, beginning opposite McCoys Mill in the old road, then northwardly with the meanders of the river, on the most suitable ground until it shall strike the Bridge, near Wm. Armstrong's cabin, thence with the meanders of said river, on the most suitable ground, until it shall intersect the old road opposite James Hunter's Still house, also to vacate such part of all roads as the Viewers may think proper, in that direction.

Ordered that William Brown, Richard Hoover and John Watts be and they are hereby appointed view-ers and John Kerr Surveyor of said road and that they meet at the Commissioner's office in Franklinton on Thursday the 12th day of August 1819 and after being qualified as the law directs, proceed to View and survey said route and make report thereof at next regular meeting of the Commissioners of Franklin County August 4, 1819.

ARMSTRONG ROAD OBJECTED TO.

On the return of a road at the East side of the Scioto river as follows:

Beginning at a point in the old road opposite McCoy's mill on the east side of the said river thence northwardly with the meanders of the same to a Bridge near Williamston's Cabin, Thence Northwardly with meanders of the said river to a point in the old road opposite James Hunter's still house, Surveyed by John Kerr.

RETURN OF VIEWERS ON SAID ROAD.

We the viewers of the above or within described road proceeded to view said road according to the order of the Commissioners of Franklin County having been sworn as the law directs and give our opinions in favor of a road near the river bank according to the within plat believing it to be of Public Utility August 12, 1819.

Whereupon to wit on the 4th day of Nov. 1819 to-wit Ebenezer Richards produced the following remonstrance:

TO THE HONORABLE THE COMMISSIONERS OF FRANKLIN COUNTY:

The remonstrance of the Subscribers, Land holders of said County humbly sheweth that a County road has lately been located by Richard House, John Watts and William Brown, viewers, and John Kerr, Surveyor. Beginning opposite McCoy's mill and ending at Hunter's still house which the undersigners believe not to be of Public Utility in as much as there is now established near the same a Public road on better ground and much shorter. They therefore pray that a review may be had of said road.

It is therefore ordered that Billingsby Bule, Nicholas Goetschius, William D. Henderson, William H. Richardson and Amor Cox be and they are hereby appointed to review the afore road and that they meet at the house of Joseph Gorton, Esq. in Franklinton on the 25th day of this Instant and after being duly sworn as the law directs proceed to review said road and make report thereof at the next regular meeting of the Commissioners of Franklin County Nov. 6, 1819.

Whereas the above named reviewers did not report as they have been directed It is therefore ordered that the objections against the road petitioned for by William Armstrong and others be void, that it be henceforth of Record agreeable to the returns made by William Brown, Richard House and John Watts, viewers, and John Kerr, Surveyor, the 12th day of August 1819, and that the same may be opened fourty feet wide and made in other respects as the law directs and that the Trustees through whose Townships said road runs be notified of this order March 17, 1820.

On the petition of Ebenezer Richards, Mison Perry and Sam'l Hunter for damage in consequence of a road running through their land lately located by Richard House, John Watts and William Brown, viewers, and John Kerr, Surveyor, Beginning opposite McCays mill and ending at Hunter's Still House.

It is therefore ordered that Steven Maynard, Chandler Rodgers, Tracy Wilcox, Robert Justice, Israel Carr be and they are hereby appointed viewers on said road and that they meet at the house of Amazian Hutcheson on the 2nd Friday of May next and after being qualified proceed to view the land of the said Ebenezer Richards, Mison Perry and Samuel Hunter where said road runs through and assess the damages if any there be and make report thereof at the next regular meeting of the Commissioners of Franklin County March 24, 1820.
