BROWN'S PETITION.

On the petition of William Brown and others for a road commencing at the Court House in Franklinton thence running a South course along the lane past McCoy's Tanyard to continue along said lane until it strikes ~~Arthur~~ O'Hara's north line thence along the lane between Lucas Sullivant & said O'Hara until it crosses the Pond Branch past David Jameson, from thence on the highest and best ground until it intersects Brown's road, so called in Franklin Township, thence along said road past William Brown in Jackson Township until it crosses Luke Run, thence of the highest best ground until it intersects the road leading from Franklinton to Chillicothe on the line between John Kile and Samuel Cleet and to vacate all that part of said County road north of where it strikes said road in Franklin Township.

It is therefore ordered that John Brickel, Robert Ballantine and James Culbertson be appointed viewers and Ezekial Curtis Surveyor on said road and that they meet at the house of Joseph Gorton, Esq., on the 12th day of November 1819, and after being qualified as the law directs proceed to view and survey said road and report thereof at the next regular meeting of the Commissioners of Franklin County November 3, 1819.

W. corner of the Court House, thence S 12°-E 50 S 24 L. S 67 W 84 P. to Brown Road; thence South 124 P. S 41 E 50 P., S 17 P. E 9 W 18 P. 15 C., S 5 E 56 S 50 P. S 18 E 68 P. S 30 E 7 P. 50 links S 6 E 16.50 to the road leading from Franklinton to Chillicothe intersecting it on the line between John Kile and Samuel Clark, November 12, 1819.

Survey of a road according to the order of the Honorable Commissioners of Franklin County - Beginning S 22. 30 W 1 chain and fifty links from the Southwest corner of the Court House S 12°- E 50. 20 Chs. S 67 W 84 Ch. to Brown Road; S 124 C. S 18 E 41.50 S 17 S 9°- W 18.50, S 5 E 56.50, S 18 E 68, S 30 E 7.50, S 60 E 16.50 to the road leading from Franklinton to Chillicothe intersecting it on the line between John Kile and Samuel Clark, November 12, 1819.

Where upon Woolry Conrad produced the following remonstrance:

TO THE HONORABLE COMMISSIONERS OF FRANKLIN COUNTY: The petition of the undersigned humbly represent to your honors that the road petitioned for by William Brown and others, Beginning at the Court House in Franklinton, thence past McCoy's Tanyard to the line between Arthur O'Haras and Lucas Sullivants, thence with said line extended past David Jamesons till it intersects the line known by the name of Brown's road, thence with said road past William Browns, thence to Lick run, thence the nearest and best way to the line between Samuel Clarks and John Kile, thence with said line to the road that leads from Franklinton to Chillicothe which petition is unnessacary and aught not to be granted and we your petitioners do pray that your honors will proceed to act as is in such cases made and provided for by law and we your petitioners will ever pray. March 8, 1820.

It is therefore ordered that Chandler Rodgers, Stephen Maynard, Samuel Henderson, Re-compence Stansberry & Daniel Hess be appointed Reviewers and on said road and that they meet at the house of Jacob Keller, Esq. on the 9th June next and after being qualified as the law directs proceed to review said road and make report thereof at the next meeting of the Commissioners of Franklin County at their next regular Session March 16, 1820.

On the petition of Lucas Sullivant for damages on a road petitioned for by William Brown and others lately surveyed by E. Curtis which road passes through said Sullivants land the courses and distances of said survey are as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at S 22.30 W 1 chain & 50 links from the S. W. corner of the Court House; thence S 12 E 50 chains & 20 links; thence S 67 W 84 chains to Browns and I the said Lucas Sullivant therefore prays for the benefit of the 7th & 8th Section of the Act entitled and Act for opening & regulating roads & highways.

It is therefore ordered that Rev. James Hoge, Robert Elliot, Samuel G. Fleming & Daniel Hess & Samuel Davis be appointed viewers on said road and that they meet at the house of Joseph Gorton, Esq. in Franklinton on the 28th Instant at 9 o'clock A.M. and after being qualified as the law directs proceed to view said road taking to view the above prayer and if necessary reexamine as the law directs in the 8th Section and make report thereof at the next regular meeting of the Commissioners of Franklin County.

On the return of viewers for damages on the petition of Lucas Sullivant as follows:  
In obedience to your order of the seventeenth Instant, to us Directed to view a road Petitioned for by William Brown etc, and surveyed by E. Curtiss the courses of which road are as follows, to-wit: Beginning S 22<sup>o</sup>-30 W one chain 50 links from the S. W. corner of the Court House; thence S 12 E 50 chains & 20 links; thence S 57 W 84 chains to Brown's road which said first mentioned road was objected to by Lucas Sullivant and on viewing the same we concieved it would be expensive to improve and that the said objector- would be justly entitiled to Two Hundred Dollars damages.
