On the petition of Lincoln Goodale and others for a road. Beginning at the North end of High Street in Columbus, thence on the most convenient ground and as near a direct course as convenience will permit until it intersects the road from Franklinton to Worthington at or near Esq, Beile or Rosewell Cook.

Ordered that William Fleming, Jacob Grubb, Horace Walcut be appointed viewers and Jerimiah Mc-Lane - Surveyor on said road and that they meet at the office of Eli C. King, Esq. on the 7th day of June at 8 o'clock and after being qualified as the law directs proceed to view and survey said road and make report thereof at the next regular meeting of the Commissioners of Franklin County. RETURN OF THE ABOVE PETITION FOR A ROAD, JUNE 12, 1820.

Beginning at the North end of High Street in the town of Columbus and running with the course thereof N 12 W 3 miles on the route formerly run by Joseph Vance, thence N 20 W 133 poles to a point in the present traveled road from Columbus to Worthington on the Bridge near the Horace or Ox grist mill, thence N 7 E 20 P. up the hill to a small Beech opposite Wilcox's tavern, thence N 15 W 2 miles 12 poles to a point in the Worthington road opposite Roswell's cook house, the whole distance being 5 m. 165 p.

We, the subscribers, viewers, as above named attended the survey upon said road, carefully viewed the ground passed over, are of opinion that the route is suceptiable of making a good road with some labor and the same if established and opened will be of great Public Utility. Witness our hands the date above.

Who reported favorable on a road leading out of the North end of High Street in Columbus as will more fully appear in the above mentioned page.

Where upon the following petition was presented to the Commissioners of Franklin County.

We the subscribers hereby represent to the Commissioners of Franklin County, that we and each of us will be much aggrieved should the road viewed, surveyed and returned to your office to commence at the North end of High Street in the Town of Columbus and to run N 12 W -- by reason of the said road dividing our lands in a manner highly detrimental and injurious and to our great damages for these reasons we object to the establishment of the same, But if allowed we pray that Judicious persons may be appointed to view and assess the damage that we and each of us will sustain by reason of establishment of said road according to law. John Kerr, Wm. Doherty atty for John Wadells, John Hunter, John Brickel, Joseph Hunter & Lewis Runckle.

It is therefore ordered that John Ransburg, Richard House, Wm. Brown, John Watts & Arthur Ohara be appointed viewers of the afore-mentioned road and that they meet at the house of Eli C. King, Esq., in Columbus on the 1st of August next at 8 o'clock and after being qualified as the law directs proceed to view said road and assess the damage if any there be and make return thereof at the next regular meeting of the Commissioners of Franklin County.

ROAD FROM THE NORTH END OF HIGH STREET, COLUMBUS

Whereupon the Commissioners of Franklin County did on the 27th day of June 1820 appoint John Ransburg, Richard House, William Brown, John Watts, & Arthur OHara to view said road and assess the damages through the lands of the following petitioners to-wit: John Kerr, William Doherty, attorney for John Wadde, John Hunter, John Brickel, Joseph Hunter & Lewis Runkle, and whereas the above mentioned viewers did not make return of their proceeding as directed by law agreeable to the order on record.

It is therefore ordered that the said road be henceforth of record agreeable to the following courses and distances. Beginning at the North end of High Street in Columbus and running with the course thereof N 12 W 3 miles on the route formerly Sur. by Joseph Vance; thence N 20 W 133 poles to a point in the present traveled road from Columbus to Worthington on the Bridge near Horace or Ox grist mill; thence N 7 E 20 P. up the hill to a small beech opposite Wilcox's Tavern; thence N 15 W 2 miles, 12 poles, to a point in the Worthington road opposite Rosswell's cook house, the whole distance

being Five miles, 165 poles.

And it is further ordered that the said road be opened sixty feet wide and made in other respects as the law directs and that the Trustees through which Townships said road runs be notified of this order October 16, 1820.

On the petition of Lincoln Goodale et al for a road out of High Street in Columbus North to Worthington which was appealed to the Court of Common Pleas of our said County by John Wadell October 27th 1820. and the same having been adjudicated on by said Court and dismissed at the cost of said appellant.

It is therefore ordered that the Trustees of Montgomery and Clinton Township proceed to open said road as viewed and laid out at 60 feet wide, and in all other respects agreeable to law.
