On the petition of Timothy Lee and others for a road in Franklin County To commence on the afore said County road near John Carvers in Harrison Township run by or near Samuel McDaniel and terminate on the State road near Ebenezer Butlers in Mifflin Township.

Ordered that John Brickel, Robert Balentine and Edward Livingston be appointed viewers and Stephen R. Price - Surveyor on said road and that they meet at the house of Jacob Smith, Esq., on the 2nd day of August next and after being qualified as the law directs proceed to and survey said route & make report thereof at the next regular meeting of the Commissioners of Franklin County.

On the return of Stephen R. Price, Surveyor, and Edward Livingston, John Brickel and Robert Ballentine, viewers, who have reported favorably on the above petition for a road as follows:

Beginning at the State road leading up Alum creek in Mifflin Township, Franklin Township and at the South side of the first fording of said creek North of John Turneys and at the foot of a high bank thence along the low bank of said creek the thence following courses N 85 E 22 P. N 32 E 44 P. N 11 E 26 P. to the foot of a high bank N 40 E 114 P. N 42 E 448 P. to the south end of Samuel McDonald's lane, thence along said lane N 2 E 80 P. to the North end of said lane; thence N 10 E 92 P. to the road leading up Big Walnut on the high bank of said creek and where the said creek comes to the foot of said high bank, August 10, 1820.

It is therefore ordered that the above road be henceforth of Record agreeable to the above courses and distances and that the same be opened forty feet wide as the law directs and that the Trustees be notified of this order October 23, 1820.
