

FRANKLINTON, DEC. 2, 1822.

On the petition of Charles P. Hempsted & G. W. Hart praying for a Public road to be laid out through the Township of Harrison in said County of Franklin.

Beginning on the east side of a State road leading by George Osborn & Edward Phelps Gin and to run East 64 rods and thence the nearest and best route by Isaac Harrison & G.W. Hart to intersect the County road on the County line near Ambrose Dixons and there to end.

Ordered that Artemas Cutter, Henry Harrison & Orange Johnson be appointed viewers and Timothy Lee Esq., be appointed Surveyor and that they meet at the houses of George Osborn of Harrison Township on the 25th day of instant December at 9 o'clock in the morning and after being qualified as the law directs by a Magistrate -- That they proceed to view and survey said road and make return to the Commissioners of Franklin County at their next meeting.

On return of a road Petitioned for by Hempsted and others agreeably with an order of the Commissioners of Franklin County Dec, term 1822 a road was located according to the following metes & bounds -- Beginning on the State road leading by Maj. George Osborn's & Capt. Ed Phelps in the Township of Harrison - at the line between the farms of Cruger Wright & John Cooper, thence East on said line 116 poles, thence North 71° East 158 poles, thence North 88° E 46 poles to the 1 mile tree -- thence same course 18 poles, thence North 60 East 56 poles, thence North 27° East 84 poles crossing Big run at 4 poles, thence North 5 East 162 poles to the 2 mile tree North 22° E 320 poles to the 3 mile tree, thence same course 88 poles to the County road near the County line at Ambrose Dixons & their ending -- Being 3 miles & 88 poles, Dec, 25, 1822.
