On the Petition of Rueben Carpenter and others for a road as follows. Beginning at Worthington passing near M. Trumbull, Louis ReLay to George Farr in Harrison Township, thence near the Methodist Meeting house, thence near William Westervelt and to intersect the County road that passes by Gideon W. Hart and that Northerly part of the road that leads from Columbus to Delaware County line on the west side of Alum Creek from the Widow Whites in Harrison Township to the County line would be of great Utility to be altered so as to cross the said creek near the Mill Dam and pass up to the County line on the east side of said creek; and to alter the above described part of the road.

Ordered that Levy Penny, Orange Johnson & Adna Bristol viewers and Charles Stacey, Surveyor, on said route and that they meet at the office of John Goodrich in Worthington on the 21st June 1824 and after being duly qualified as the law directs proceed to view and survey said route and make report thereof at the next meeting of the Commissioners of Franklin County.

On the return of the foregoing road we the Subscribers agreeable to an order to us directed by the Commissioners of Franklin County on Petition of Rueben Carpenter and others for a road beginning at Worthington passing near Moses Trumbull, Louis ReLay to George Farr in Harrison Township thence near the Methodist Meeting House, thence William Westervelts to intersect the County road that passes by Gideon W. Hart also for altering the road that leads from Columbus to Delaware County line, on the

west side of Alum Creek from the W. Whites in Harrison Township to Delaware County line so as to cross the sd. creek near the Mill Dam and to pass up on the east side of said creek to the County line, assembled at the office of John Goodrich, Esq., and after having been duly qualified proceeded to view and survey said route and believe that a road on the first mentioned route may be made at a reasonable expense and would be of great Utility and the other route would be of great improvement if allowed by rendering the distance shorter & on suitable ground for making a road. The survey of the first mentioned route as follows, Viz. Beginning at Worthington ranging North 150 rods, thence N 37° - E 40 rods, thence N 26° - E 48 rods, thence N 84° - E 61, thence 61-1/4° - E 84, thence N 86° - E 84, thence N 67-3/4° - E 100, thence N 84-1/2° E 100, thence 71° - E 42, thence N 62 E 40, thence N 52° - E 44, thence N 89-1/2° - E 164, thence N 65-1/4 E 264 rods, thence N 76° - E 180, thence East 120 rods thence on a town road established by the Trustees of Sharon Township to the bank of Alum creek, thence N 16 rods, thence N 75° - E 36, thence S 34° - E 30, thence E 200 rods to Fare's, thence N 20° - W 110 rods, thence East 510 rods to the road passing Harts; the other beginning at the W. Whites, thence N 154 rods, thence N 26-1/4° - W 103 rods to the County line with marks and signs as the law directs on the above named routes.
