On the application of John M. Edminston as follows.

To the Honorable the Com. of Franklin County. The undersigned begs leave to represent That by reference to the within Protracted survey of road it will be seen that the survey does not correspond with the road opened. I traveled Eastwardly from South Columbus to Alum Creek from the place called McGowan's corners where said road enters the lands of the undersigned, by running North of and parallel with said traveled road, that Difficulties are likely to arise in consequence of this mistake in the Surveyors return of said road as recorded in your office, the Citizens not being compelled to labor on said road in consequence of it not being opened on the survey, & your Petitioner being desirous of fencing and improving part of his land adjoining said road and not knowing where to establish his fences to inclose the same so as to form a lane for said road to pass through, therefore he prays that you will appoint viewers and Surveyor to correct those errors in the Survey of said road as returned & recorded by establishing the road on or as near as practicable to the ground on which it is opened & now traveled. Beginning at McGowan's corner aforesaid and ending at Alum Creek.
Signed 22nd June 1824.

Ordered that Philo Homstead, John Wilcox & John Cuning be appointed viewers on said road & - Jeremiah McLene, Surveyor, and that they meet at the office of David W. Deshler, Esq., on the 30th Instant and being qualified proceed and view said road and make report thereof at next meeting of the Commissioners.

On the return of a road Petitioned for by John M. Edmiston.

Pursuant to the foregoing order we proceeded to view the ground which the annexed plat represents for a road, Beginning at the Northeast corner of the lot called McGowan's, on which the town of South Columbus is located, running from thence with a Southerly boundary of the present traveled road S 69°- E 40 poles to a stake, thence leaving the road on the Northeast & running S 42°- E 32 poles to the Section line (those two corners run through lands of John M. Edmiston) thence East on the Section line passing Condon's Cabbins 103 poles to Edminstons S.E. corner continued with Section line & on the present traveled road crossing Adam's Bridge 183 poles, at 65 poles, set first mile post. Cont'd East passing I. Taylors gate at 91 poles, course Cont'd passing a stone corners to I. Taylor, Wallace White at 185 poles, course Cont'd through the lane & over the cosway to Whites cross road at 263 poles, Cont'd with the Section line along the lane set 2 mile post at 320 poles, course Continued with road and is at line 32 poles, to a post, thence N 50°- E 16 poles to the west bank of Alum Creek opposite the fording, the whole distance being two miles and 48 poles and we do recomend the establishment of the same as a road of great Public Utility, note the road be opened on the N.E. side on the two present courses the others to be the center of the road.
