Petitions Of Sundry Persons of Sharon Township for Damages on a State Road
To the Honorable Commissioners of Franklin County and State of Ohio, Whereas the Legislator
of this State at their last session in 1823 and 1824, granted a State road to be laid out from Columbus
to Delaware leading through Sharon Township, in said County and appointed Commissioners to lay out
said road which they have done to the damage of the subscribers whose lands said road runs through
in said Sharon Township, and we the subscribers wish your Hon orable body to appoint such men as you in
your wisdom shall think proper to appraise the Damages we shall sustain by said road running through our
lands. Dated at Sharon Township, the 6th Nov. 1824.

Record Of The State road leading out of the north end of High Street of Columbus to Norton in Delaware County or so much thereof as runs through Franklin County.

Commencing at the N. line of the Town of Columbus in Main Street at a point 17 feet E. of the W. line N.W.C. of said street thence N. 12° W. by the needle or magnetic meriden at 1 mile a post at 2 mile a post at 2 mile 232 post at 3 M apost thence N. 15° W. at 3 M 160 poles intersected old road near the house of Wilcox 4 M a tree at 5 miles apost 186 poles intersected old State road at the N. line of Philo P. Webster's land near W. C. of said Starr's Barn thence N. 3° E. at 11 M. 190 poles apost N. of H. Crossley's thence N. 12° W. at 11 M. 274 poles apost on top of a hill thence N. 24° W. at 11 M. 308 Franklin and Delaware County Line at 12 M. apost

This route crossed the Olentangy River a little north of Worthington and continued along the west side of the river to the County line

Ordered that the above road be henceforth of record according to the above causes and distance and affixed monuments and that the same be opened, sixty six feet wide and made in other respects as the law directs and that the trustees through whos Township said road runs be notified of this order.

RETURN OF A STATE ROAD FRANKLIN COUNTY THAT RUNS FROM WORTHINGTON TO DELAWARE CTY. LINE

FIELD NOTES

Commencing where James Kilbourn's Survey of the road from Columbus to Norton leaves the State road at Washbrook North of Worthington: Thence North along said State road 264 rods to letter /A/ on the map near Rodney Constock's house, thence N. $50\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W. 140. Poles to /B/: Thence N. 31° W. 150 Poles to /C/: Thence N. 36° W. 56 poles, to /D/: Thence N. 37° W. 62 poles to /E/: Thence N. 16° W. 112 poles to post at /F/: and a dry Mulberry South 20 links Thence west 8 poles to Whetstone river; Thence cross river 8 poles and to a beach tree 7 poles: Thence N. 6° W. 60 poles to intersection of State road at letter (G) on the map.

I do certify this plat and field notes to be correct agreeably to the survey by me made; having been first duly sworn errors excepted.

The undersigned having been appointed by the act of the last General assembly Commissioners to review and if we should deem it expedient to change the location of that part of the State road leading from Columbus to Norton which lies between the Town of Worthington and the south line of Delaware County.

This seems to be a resurvey of the State Road from Columbus to Norton beginning in the area of High Street and North Street in Worthington and going then northwesterly to the Scioto River, across the river and continuing along the west side of the river to the County line

Have proceeded in obedience to the act aforesaid to review said road and are of opinion that a change therein will promote both the public and private convenience, We have therefore caused the said change to be made and established: as the annexed Plat and field notes of H. Kilbourn the surveyor by us employed will fully show.
