Beginning at the Black Lick Road Near David Smith's, thence West with the Section line to the West line of Plain Township; thence the Nearest and best ground to intersect the Road leading from Lees Mill on Big Walnut passing Francis Climers; Your petitioners therefore Pray that your honours would appoint Suitable Characters to view the ground as aforesaid and Make Report to you according to law and your Petitioners will ever Pray etc.

Field Notes of a Road petitioned for by C. Harbaugh and others Dec. Term 1827.

Beginning at the Black Lick Road near David Smith's in Plain on the line between Section Ten and Eleven, thence West on the Section line 320 poles to the first Mile tree, same course 320 poles to the Second Mile tree, same course 320 poles to the Third Mile tree, same course 320 poles to the fourth Mile tree, same course 64 poles to the West Line of Plain, same course 67 poles, thence North 60 West 50 poles to a Road from Lee's Mill leading by Francis Cliner and thence ending, being four Miles and 178 poles.
