MARTIN WAGGONERS PETITION FOR NEW ROAD JANUARY 12th.1830

TO

THE HONOURABLE THE COMMISSIONERS OF FRANKLIN COUNTY

Now composing a board in and for Said County the petition of divers inhabitants of the Townships of Truro and Jefferson and those adjoining humbly Showith that your Petitioners labour under great inconvenience for want of a Road or highway leading from the Jacksonville Road at the Meeting house where the road leading from Columbus to Hebron Crosses Said Road, thence North on the line between Mathew Crawfords and James Grayhams, thence North to the West end of William G. Grayham's Stone quarry, thence North on the best and nearest Rout to the turnpike leading from Columbus to Granvill 30 or 40 Rods east of Mr. Deans Stone house crossing the turnpike, thence North with a little variation to the line between the lands of Samuel Devinport and Joseph Geiger, thence North on Said line to the Jersey Road leading from Columbus to Granville between James Shaw and Michael Stagg, your Petitioners believeing Said Road will be of great Utility to the publick humbly Pray the board of Commissioners to appoint proper persons to View and locate the same according to law and they will Pray etc.

A Survey of a road on a Petition of Martin Waggoner and others for a new Road Commencing where the road from Columbus to Hebron Crosses the Road leading from Jacksonville To the Susceedor Meting house in truro Township, thence North 200 poles on the line between Mathew Crawford and J. Graham North 24° E.64 poles to the line of David French's land North 56 poles One Mile Tree North 41 poles Too Frenches North line, North 21° W.76 poles to the line between John Ellsay and J. Graham North 96 poles on the line between Ellsay and John Graham North 15° E.44 poles North 10° E.36 poles North 2° W.27 poles two Mile Tree North 2° W.53 poles to the west end of Wm. Graham's Stone quarry North 5. E.169 poles to the Road from Columbus to Granville North 62. poles North 23° W.9 poles three Mile Tree North 23° W.42 poles to a line between 100 acres lots North 278 poles, 4 Mile Tree, on the Said line North 320 poles 5 Mile Tree on Said line L.Devinport's field North 32 poles 6 Mile Tree on the said line at haven Meddow, North 212 poles to a Stack with some sickamore grubbs on the Road from Columbus by Hedlay's Mill to Granville following the foresaid line of lots.

The foregoing Return of View, Survey, Platt and Report being filed on the 7th. day of June 1830 and Red on the same day and also on the 8th day of Said June 1830 thereupon it was ordered by the Commissioners of Franklin County that the foregoing Road be henceforth of Record agreeable to the Platt and Survey thereof and that the same be opened Sixty feet wide and made in all other Respects according to law, and that Notice of this order be given to the Trustees of the Several Townships through which the same may pass and that they govern them Selves accordingly.
