STATE ROAD FROM SEDWICK TO NATIONAL ROAD AT ALLUM CREEK

Whereas the general assembly of the State of the State of Ohio, did pass a law, bearing date February 14th. 1831, whereby they did appoint John Long and Philamon Neidley of Franklin County, to lay out and establish a State Road, Commencing at the Farm house of Richard Sedwick, to Run on the highest and best ground to the farm of Alexander Mooberry, Passing east of the dwelling house of the Said Mooberry, thence on the Nearest and best ground to intersect the National Road, leading to Columbus a few Rods, east of the bridge over Allum Creek. The aforesaid John Long and P. Needles, Personally appeared before me the Subscriber one of the acting Justice of the Peace in and for Franklin County and was Severally Sworn as the Law directs to lay out and establish the aforesaid State Road; Also A.V. Taylor was appointed by the aforesaid Commissioners to Survey the aforesaid State Road, and John W. Long and John Needles Chain Carriers, and John Needles Marker, all of which was Severally Sworn to discharge there duty faithfully according to Law.

We Certify in Compliance with a law of the general assembly of the State of Ohio bearing date the 14th. day of Feby. 1831, we have caused to be Surveyed, and have laid out and established, the State Road Set forth in the Said Law, for which we John Long and Philamon Needle, of the County of Franklin was appointed Commissioners and the following is the course and distances of the Survey of Said Road With the annexed Plat Commencing at a Stake in the Old State Road Near the dwelling house of Richard Sedwick, the School house door bearing S.3°W. from Said Stake, thence N.48 $\frac{1}{2}$ °W.178 poles to a Stake W.Side of Old Road South of the lane, Thence N.37°W.142 poles Total 320.1 Mile tree Passing Switser's house at 44 poles, N.37°W.110 Poles a Stake Near an Old Cabbin on Rosse's land, N.23°W.58 poles to South end of A. Mooberry's land, N.29 $\frac{1}{2}$ °W.72 poles in A. Mooberry's lane passing E. of his house at 52 poles, N.17°W.80 poles (Total 320) 2 Miles tree a beech, Wedge of Old Road N.24°W.80 poles S. bank of the Run N.62°W.12 poles Crossing of the Run in the Old Road, N.30°W.100 poles to a Stake, N.33°W.86 poles, Stake at the Run S. line of Barr's land E. of fields, N.20°W.42 poles (Total 320 poles) Thence Mile Tree Elm, N.20°W.170 poles to the United States Road 10 Rods W.of J. Turner's house, Whole distance 3 Miles and one $\frac{1}{2}$ and 10 Rods to the National Road.
