The Undersigned free holders of Said County, beg leave to recommend to your honorable body the Necessity of a County Road as follows; Beginning at James O. S. Langton's, on the County Road running from Fullers Mill, to the Scioto River, thence on an easterly Course, to an Oak Ash and Hickory westerly Corner to I. S. Rodgers land, thence with his line S. 38° E. 125 poles, to an Elm Ash and Hickory, thence to the N. E. Corner of T. T. Kains Orchard, thence to the W. end of T. Temples land, thence through his land, and eastwardly to Wm Wilcox's in Norwich Township, thence eastwardly, So as to intersect the National Road, where the Georgesville Road crosses the same, Your Petitioners, therefore pray your honourable body to appoint suitable men to View Survey and Locate said Road in Conformity with the statute in such cases made and provided, in duty bound ever pray July 2nd 1835.
