Pursuant to the annexed order I Proceeded on the 11th day of February 1839 under the direction of Jacob Hare and Jas Harris Viewers to Make a Survey and location of an alteration of a Part of the Hebron Road generally known by the Livingston Road as Petitioned for by Peter S. Williams and others as follows Viz; Beginning at a Stake Near the School house on William Franchers land the South East Corner of Section Eighteen in Township twelve and Range twenty-one Refugee land in Truro Township thence with the Section line West 320 Poles to a Stake from which a W. Elm Marked One Mile bears S. 81 W. 6 Poles-- Same Course 61 Poles to the east bank of Allum Creek- Same Course Crossing Said Creek 19 Poles to intersect Said Livingston Road on the West Side of Said Creek Whole distance 1 Mile 310 Poles-- Length of Old 2 Miles 72 Poles Making a difference of 102 Poles in favor of the New Road- I Certify the above Field Notes to be Correct as taken by Me on the ground and that the above Plat is a true Protraction of the Same
