a Stake Marked 1 Mile Same Course on Said line and Passing through the land of Ridgway 143 Poles to the west Corner of Jones and Latham- thence Same Course on the line between Jones and Latham 170 Poles to a Stake in the Old Granville Road and in the West line of David Nelson- thence with the west line of Said Nelson North 7 Poles to an Ash Marked 2 Mile Same Course 77 Poles to Said Nelson North West Corner on the North bank of a branch- thence with Said Nelson North line East 243 Poles to a Stake Marked 3 Mile Same Course 9 Poles to the Allum Creek Road whole distance 3 Miles and 9 Poles

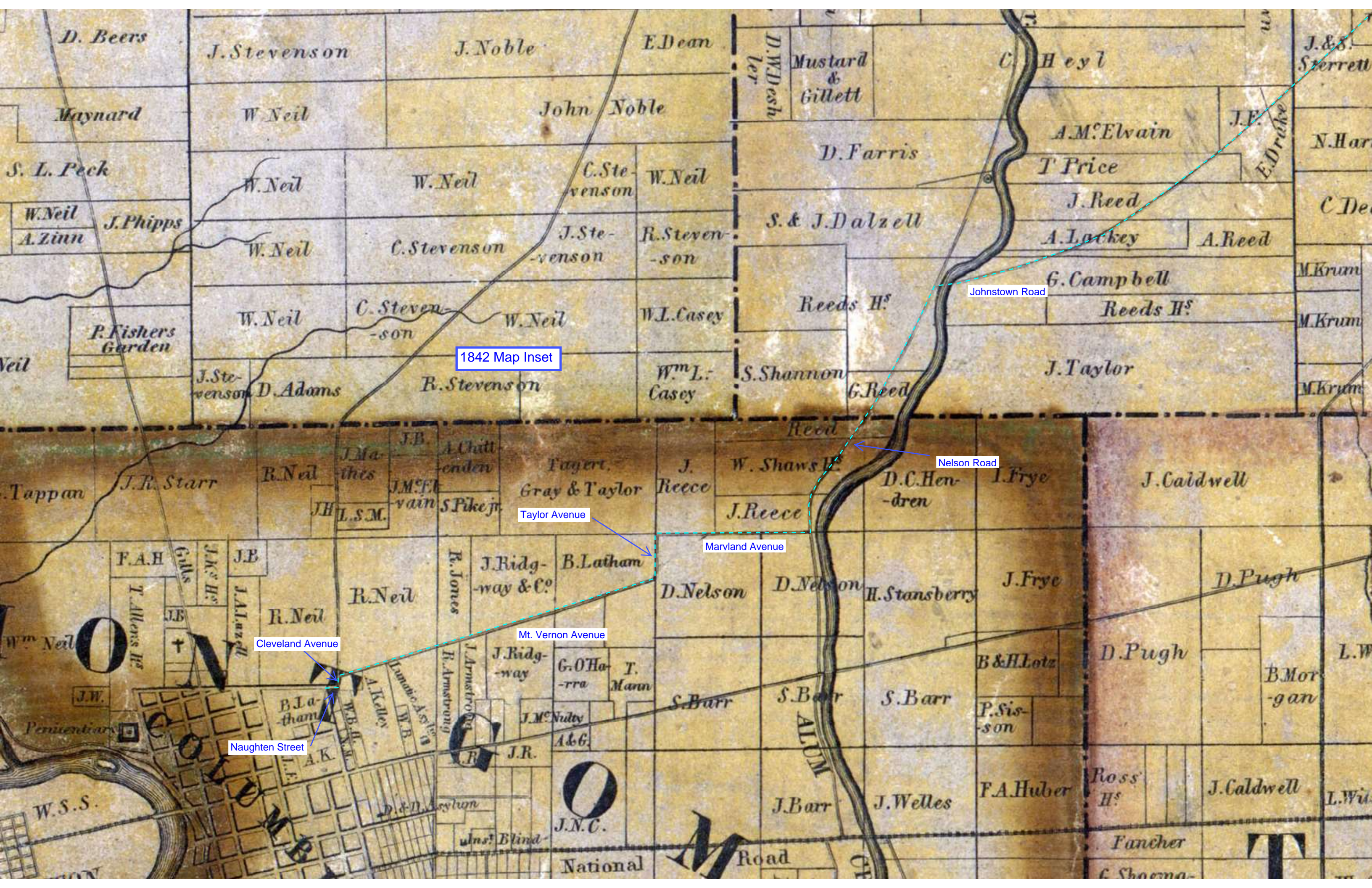
