To the Honorable the Commissioners of Franklin County

The petition of the undersigned Citizens and freeholders respectfully represent that they believe the interest and Convenience of the public require the location of a County Road, Commencing at the Turnpike Road leading from Columbus to Sandusky, on the line dividing the lands of Chancey Cook and John Buck, thence Eastwardly with the aforesaid line to the section line thence South So as to Strike the line dividing the lands of John P. Little and Joab Hoyte, thence, Eastwardly with the aforesaid line to the tier line thence South, with the aforesaid line to the line dividing the lands of John Field and Arminius Field, thence eastwardly with the aforesaid line passing through John and Walter Field's Farms to intersect the Harbour Road, and your petitioners therefore pray that the proper and legal Steps May be taken to authorize the location and Establishment of Said Road, and your petitioners will ever pray Ect John P. Little, John Field, Samuel Ranney, Walter Field, J. Pegg, A. J. Field, George T. Thompson, Samuel Miller, Conrad Beers, Cornelius Sharp, Frederick Rader, James Long, John D. Coe, Robert Innis, William Henry, Henry Innis, Harvey Coe, William A. Morris, Nathaniel Cochran, Alanson Bull.

On the petition of John P. Little and others for a New County Road. Commencing at the Turnpike Road leading from Columbus to Sandusky, on the line dividing the lands of Chauncey Cook and John Buck, thence eastwardly with the aforesaid line to the Section line, thence South So as to Strike the line dividing the lands of John P. Little and Joab Hoyte, thence eastwardly with the aforesaid line to the tier line, thence South with the aforesaid line to the line dividing the lands of John Field and Arminius Field, thence eastwardly with the aforesaid line passing through John and Walter Fields, Farms to intersect the Harbour Road.

Whereupon, the Commissioners of Franklin County appointed Miles Pinney, Potter Wright and Stephen Hoyte as Viewers and Uriah Lathrop Surveyor, and that they meet at the office of Samuel Kinnear Esq. in Clinton Township the 25th day of January 1841, or within five days thereafter and after being duly qualified according to law, proceed to View, Survey, Mark, and locate Said Road according to law, and a true plat and Survey thereof along with their report return to this Office on or before the first Monday in the Month of March 1841.

along the North line of Chauncey Cook's land Crossing a Run at 26 P. large one at 160 and 190, 320 P. to the 1st Mile Stake, 2nd Mile S 88 E. 25 P. to Cook's N. E. Corner thence S. 2 W. 6. 40 P. to a Stake, thence S. 88 E. crossing run at 85 at 89 at 91. along the Same to 131. P. 320 P. to 2nd Mile Stake. 3rd Mile, S 88. E. 95 P. S. to W. 30. S 88. E. 195 P.- 320 P. to 3rd Mile Stake, 4th Mile S. 88. E. 114. Poles, to the Harbour Road. The within Flat is a correct Protraction of the Same,

The undersigned petitioners freeholders in Said County feeling themselves much agrieved by the Survey and location of a New County Road as petitioned for by John P. Little and others Commencing at the Turnpike road leading from Columbus to Sandusky on the line dividing the lands of Chauncey Cook and John Buck, thence eastwardly with the aforesaid line to the Section line, thence South So as to Strike the line dividing the lands of John P. Little and Joab Hoyte, thence eastwardly with the aforesaid line to the tier line, thence South with the aforesaid line to the line dividing the lands of John Field Arminius Field thence eastwardly with the aforesaid line passing through John and Walter Field's Farms to intersect the Harbour Road; Your petitioners therefore pray your Honorable body to appoint Suitable Men to view Said route or location So far as it passes through their lands, and estimate the damage if any that they may Sustain, and in duty bound will ever pray
