Hamilton Road - from Johnstown Road to Dublin-Granville Road

To the Hon. the Commissioners of Franklin County,

The petition of the undersigned freeholders and Citizens of Franklin County respectfully represent that they conceive the interest and Convenience of the public as well as of individuals requires the location of a County Road, to commence where the road leading from Columbus to Johnstown crosses the east line of Mifflin Township, thence North on the line dividing the townships of Jefferson, Mifflin, Plain and Blendon, to intersect the Road leading from Worthington to Granville in Licking County, and your Petitioners therefore Pray that the proper and legal Steps may be taken to authorize the location and establishment of Said Road, and your Petitioners as in duty bound will ever Pray. On the Petition of William Beechar and others for a new County road to Commence where the Road leading from Columbus to Johnstown Crosses the east line of Mifflin Township, thence North on the line dividing the Townships of Jefferson, Mifflin, Plain and Blendon to intersect the road leading from Worthington to Granville in Licking County.

Whereupon the Commissioners of Franklin County appointed Ezra Gilbert, Charles E. Burr, and D. B. Barker Viewers, and Uriah Lathrop Surveyor, and that they meet at the Office of James Price Esq in Mifflin Township On the 20th day of July 1841 or within five days thereafter, and after being duly qualified according to law, proceed to view Survey, Mark and locate Said road according to law, and a true Plat and Survey along with their Report return to this Office on or before the first Monday in the month of December 1841.

Field Notes relating to a Survey of a County Road Beginning at the intersection of the east line of Mifflin Township and the Columbus and Johnstown Road and run North 320 poles to 1st Mile post, Continued 50 poles to the S. E. Corner of Blendon, Continued 320 poles to 2nd Mile Stake, Continued 243 poles to the Worthington and Granville Road

Agreeable to the aforesaid Order, we the Viewers after being duly Sworn, proceeded on the 20th day of July to view and examine the ground for a road as Contemplated in the above Order and are of the opinion that a road So located would be of much use to the public for the following reasons, First it would give an outlet to a large number of inhabitants Owning land and living On both Sides of the township line which they now have none but by Crossing over the peoples land. Secondly, it would give to those inhabitants living in the vicinity of the Road leading from Worthington to Granville a nearer Road to the County Seat and Seat of Government, and thirdly we are of the Opinion that the day is not far distant when it would be extended North to the County line thereby giving to the Public an equally as good and much nearer road to and from Columbus than the road which they now travel. All which is respectfully Submitted.
