COUNTY ROAD ALTERATION OF
BY GEORGE WHITE & OTHERS

ROW = 60' by law

To the Honorable the Commissioners of Franklin County,

The undersigned freeholders and residents of said County most respectfully represent that they believe the public interest and convenience require the alteration of a part of the road running up the West side of Allum Creek, past George White's in Montgomery Township,

Said Alteration to commence at the point where said road Crosses Edward Livingston's west line, thence Northwardly on the present travelled route to a point west of an Elm Tree in White's field, thence to said tree; thence North on line dividing the land of said White and John Barr to the National Road thence with said road to intersect the before mentioned road; and your petitioners will ever pray ect. Nov. 5th 1841 George White, Samuel McClelland, Joseph Wells, John Barr, David Hanley, Jacob Eberly, Origin Harris, Edwd. Livingston, Edward Livingston Jr. Thomas Hamilton, Alex. Moberly, John Butler, James Harris, Geo. W. McCloud.

On the petition of George White and others for an alteration of a part of the road running up the west side of Allum Creek, past George White's in Montgomery township; Said alteration to commence at the point where said road Crosses Edward Livingstons west line; thence Northwardly on the present travelled route to a point west of an Elm tree in White's field; thence to said tree; thence north on the line dividing the land of said White and John Barr to the National Road; thence with said road to intersect the before mentioned road.

Whereupon, the Commissioners of Franklin County appointed Nathaniel Marion, Edmund Stewart, and Moses Morrell as Viewers, and Uriah Lathrop as Surveyor, and that they meet at the Office of Thomas Wood Esq. in Montgomery township on the 15th day of January 1842, or within five days thereafter, and after being duly qualified according to Law, proceed to view mark and locate said road and a true plat and survey thereof along with their report return to this Office on or before the first Monday in the month of March 1842.

Personally came before me Thomas Wood a Justice of the Peace in and for said County, the above named Viewers and were duly sworn to faithfully discharge the duties enjoined on them by virtue of the above Order, Given under my hand this 15th day of January 1842.

In accordance with the annexed Order I proceeded on the 15th day of January 1842, to survey and mark a line for an alteration of a County Road, commencing at a point where the present travelled road crosses the west line of Edward Livingston's lands; thence along the present travelled road N. 42 W. 16 poles to a mulberry; thence N. 40 W. 64 poles to a Stake in the Road at B; thence leaving the present Road and running North to a point 22 feet west of a Stone in the Livingston road and corner to White and Barr's land; thence continue parallel to said Barrs west line 148 poles to a Stake in G. White's North line; thence N. 15 W. 46 poles to the National Road, whole distance 346 poles, according to the annexed plat which is a Correct protraction of the Same.

To the Commissioners of Franklin County; In pursuance of the annexed order, we the undersigned Viewers mentioned in Said Order, proceeded on the 15th day of January 1842 to view and Survey a County road Commencing at a Stake in George White's South line from which a Sugar tree bears North 6 poles, and running thence northwardly to a point at the National Road near John Bar's house as is represented by the field notes and plat of the surveyor which is herewith returned, and are of the Opinion that said road would be of general utility to those owning land on the line, and also to the public at large, and that the ground is such as will admit of the construction of a good and permanent road.
