We the undersigned freeholders in the County of Franklin and residents in the vicinity of the herein after described location, do petition your honorable body to locate a County road in the County of Franklin, Commencing at a point in the Chillicothe Road, in Jackson township, where the line between Henry Huffman and Samuel Landes land Crosses Said road- thence along said line until it intersects the line between Said Landes and Lyne Starlings, thence eastwardly on said line between Landes and Starlings until it strikes the Scioto River, thence down the river and binding thereon, on said Starling's land to the heads of Dun's Island, thence across the Scioto River, thence in the best and most direct line to Dalzell Hibbs & Co. mill in Hamilton township thence from said Mill East on the south line of section No. 33 of Township 4 Range 22 to the Chillicothe Road on the east side of the Scioto River. Hibbs and others for a new county road, Commencing at a point in the Chillicothe Road in Jackson township where the line between Henry Huffman and Samuel Lande's land crosses said Road, thence along said line until it intersects the line between said Landes and Lyne Starling, thence eastwardly on said line between lands and Starling until it strikes the Scioto River, thence down the River and binding thereon, on Said Starlings land to the head of Dun's Island, thence across the Scioto River, thence in the best and most direct line to Dalzell Hibbs & Co. Mill in Hamilton township thence from said Mill East on South line of Section No. 33. Township 4 Range 22 to the Chillicothe Road on the east side of the Scioto River.

Whereupon the Commissioners of Franklin County appointed Jeremiah Clark, Wm Johnson and Michael Stimmel Viewers, and John Graham Surveyor, and that they meet at the office of Z. P. Thompson Esq. on the 19th day of May 1842, or within five days thereafter, and after being duly qualified according to law, proceed to view, mark, locate and survey said road, and a true plat and survey thereof along with their report they return to this Office on or before the first Monday in the month of June A. D. 1842.

Commencing at the point named in said Order to wit, at a point in the Chillicothe Road in Jackson township where said road crosses the line dividing the lands of Henry Huffman and Samuel Landes, running thence with said line S. 29 E. 119 poles to the S. W. corner of said Landes land and in the

line of a survey entered in the name of J. Clark No. 1017, and now owned by Lyne Starling thence with said line N. 61 E. 201 poles to a Burr Oak 1 Mile Tree, Same Course Continued 120 poles to the upper Corner on the River to said Clarks Survey, thence down the river and binding thereon, S. 11 W. 31 1/2 poles to a Sugar angle tree, thence S. 7 W. 15 poles to a sugar angle tree, thence S. 2 W. 18 poles to angle post, thence S. 3 E. 32 poles to angle post at the upper end of Dun's Island, thence East, crossing the River 23 poles to the easterly bank of said river, Same Course Continued 4 poles to angle post, thence down the river S. 30 E. 10 1/2 poles to angle post, thence S. 19 E. 15 3/4 poles to angle post, thence S. 27 1/2 E. 12 1/2 poles to angle post, thence S. 25 E. 17 1/4 poles to angle post, thence S. 21 W. 20 1/2 poles to 2 Mile post, Same Course Continued 3 1/2 poles to angle post, thence N. 86 E. 14 poles to angle Post, from the door in the north and of Dalzell Hibbs & Co.
