The undersigned freeholders and residents of Franklin County respectfully represent, that the interest and convenience of the Public requires a new County Road, To Commence at the end of Peter Wilcox's lane in the north line of the Belfield survey No. 544, thence eastwardly with said line to the Dublin road, We therefore pray your honorable body to take the proper and legal steps necessary to cause a location and establishment of said road and as in duty bound will ever pray-- Abner Clapp, Arnold Clapp, S. V. Miskell, Charles W. Trafzer, Wm. Elliott, Peter Wilcox, Thomas Kellar, H. McCracken, David McCracken, H. Bromley, Jonathan Black, George W. Hyde, Thomas Read, George Fisher, Wm. G. Schringer, Milton Rogers

On the petition of Abner Clapp and Others for a new county road to commence at the end of Peter Wilcox lane in the north line of Belfields survey No. 544 thence eastwardly with said line to the Dublin road, Whereupon, the Commissioners of Franklin County appointed S. G. Renick Alanson Perry & and John Swisher Viewers, and John Graham Surveyor, and that they meet at the office of Miskell Saunders Esq in Norwich Township on the 16th day of November 1843 or within five days thereafter, and after being duly qualified according to law, proceed to view, Survey, mark and locate said road, and a true plat thereof along with their report return to this Office On or before the first Monday in the month of December A. D. 1843.

Belfield Survey No. 544 and run thence with said line N. 47 18' E. crossing a branch at 70 poles, 320 poles to the Dublin Road the place of termination, whole distance One mile.

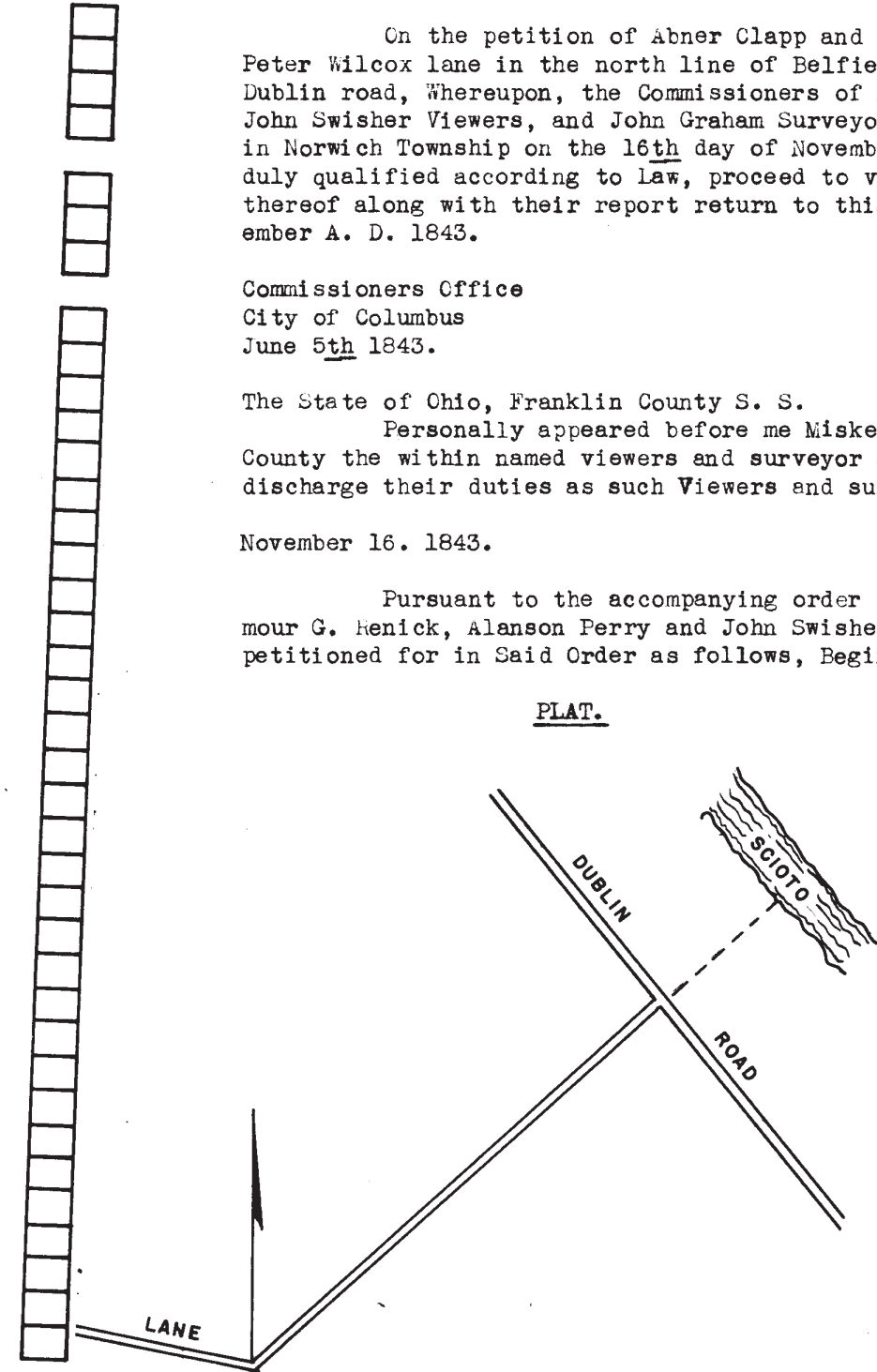

On the petition of Peter Latimer and Thomas Wilcox for damage on the county road petitioned for by Abner Clapp and Others. The Commissioners of Franklin County appointed Robert Walcutt Thomas Legg and Edmund Johnston viewers of damage, and that they meet at the office of Miskell Saunders Esq. in Norwich Township on the 27th day of April 1844 or within five days thereafter, and after being duly qualified according to law, proceed to view so much of said road as passes through the premises of said petitioners, and estimate the damage if any each of said petitioners may sustain by the establishment of said road, and make report to this Office on or before the first Monday in June 1844.
