On the petition of Abraham Swisher and others for an alteration of a County Road petitioned for by F. Sprague and others, Said alteration to Commence On the Section line of Powell and McCrackens land where the said Road now leaves the section line, thence North on said line to the Hebron and Columbus Road.

Whereupon, the Commissioners of Franklin County appointed Edward Courtright, John Miller and James Carson Viewers, and John Sharp Senr Surveyor, of said alteration, and that they meet at the Office of Solomon Shultz Esq. in Truro Township on the 20th day of May A. D. 1845. or within five days thereafter, and after being duly qualified according to Law, proceed to view, survey, mark and locate said alteration, and a true plat and survey along with your report you return to this Office On or before the first Monday in the Month of June 1845.

On an Order of the Commissioners of Franklin County dated March 5, 1845, for an alteration of a County Road petitioned for by Abraham Swisher and others, that said alteration commence in the section line of Powell & McCracken, where the Road petitioned for by F. Sprague and others from where said Road leaves said line, and after we were duly sworn as viewers by Solomon Shultz a Justice of the Peace of said Franklin County, we proceeded to view for Said alteration from said place in said line, thence north with the section line to the Hebron and Columbus Road, being 52 poles Shorter than the old road now used, and the ground for the new Road being fully as good as that of the Old one, we therefore consider that the prayer of the petitioners is reasonable, and that said alteration should be granted.

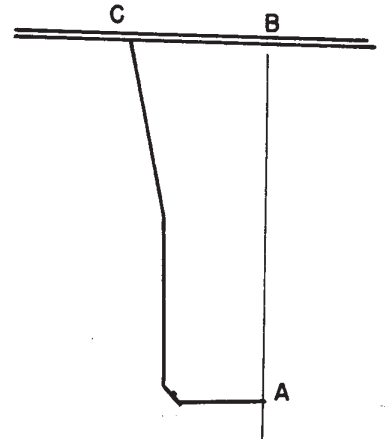
On the 20th day of May 1845, after being duly qualified according to law, by Solomon Shultz Esq. the view and survey was made according to the foregoing Order of the Commissioners, Beginning at a state on the section line of Powell and McCrackens, where the present County Road leaves said line, thence North on said line to the Hebron and Columbus Road, One mile and nine links to a Stone set in the line of said Road, of which the following is a plat. The part of the Road required to be altered was chained, and is one mile and fifty two poles and about 5 links in length.
