To the Honorable the Commissioners of Franklin County. Gentlemen.

The undersigned freeholders of said County would most respectfully represent, that their interest and convenience require the location of a County road forty feet in width, Commencing at the National Road in Truro Township at the south east Corner of Robert Dixon's land, thence north to the road called the old pike. And your petitioners ask that the necessary steps may be taken for the location and establishment of said road. Dec 2nd 1847 James Enlows, David Taylor, John Courtright, A. V. Taylor, Wm. F. Armstrong, Thomas Armstrong, Baranabus Harris, Arthur McCracken, Gilbert Green, Absalom Butler, David S. Fancher, Andrew Besse, Elijah F. Timbrell.

To McKee Thompson, John W. Long and James Carson, viewers, and John Sharp, Surveyor.

Whereas James Enlows and others have petitioned the Commissioners of Franklin County for the location of a County Road forty feet wide, Commencing at the National Road in Truro Township at the South east corner of Robert Dixons land, thence north to the road called the Old Pike, You have thereupon been appointed by said Board as viewers and Surveyor, to perform the duties pointed out by the law in such case made and provided.

You will meet for that purpose on the tenth day of February 1848 at Solomon Shultz's in Truro Township and after being sworn proceed to the discharge of your duties.

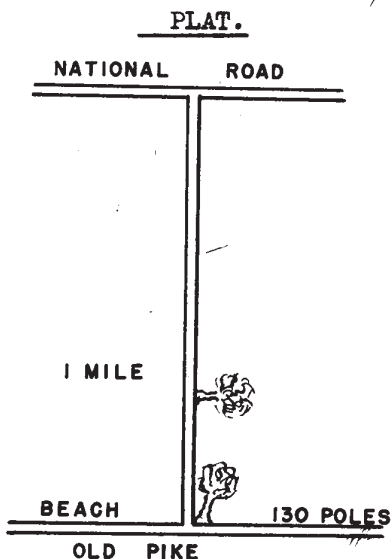

To the County Commissioners of Franklin County in Session March 6th 1848,

The undersigned respectfully shows that a County road laid out and run by order of your board in February 1848, in Truro Township in this County, runs along the east line of the land of the undersigned and thereby takes half of the width of said road, towit; about 20 ft off of the east line of said tract and in length about 200 rods of his land; thereby damaging the land of the undersigned seriously. He therefore claims damage to such an amount as shall be assessed in consequence of such road; and prays that the remedy pointed out by law will be extended to him. Columbus March 6th 1848.
