The undersigned freeholders ask for the location of a County Road on the following route commencing in the Alton Road where the line between Wm. Beatty and John S. Beatty crosses the same in Pleasant Township, thence with their said line to Darby Big Run; thence up said run crossing the same at a suitable place to the line between the same parties, thence with their said lines easterly and in the same direction as near as the ground will admit to the Highland Road on the line of the new Turnpike. You have been appointed by the Commissioners of Franklin County to view and survey a route for a new County Road petitioned for by James S. Beatty and others, Commencing in the Alton Road where the line between Wm. Beatty and John S. Beatty crosses the same in Pleasant Township, thence with their

said line to Darby Big Run; thence up said Run, crossing the same at a suitable place, to the line between the said parties; thence with their line eastwardly and in the same direction as near as the ground will admit to the Highland Road or line of the new Turnpike. And you will meet on the Sixth day of May 1848 at Wm. Beatty's for the discharge of said duties, and comply with the law as hereto annexed.

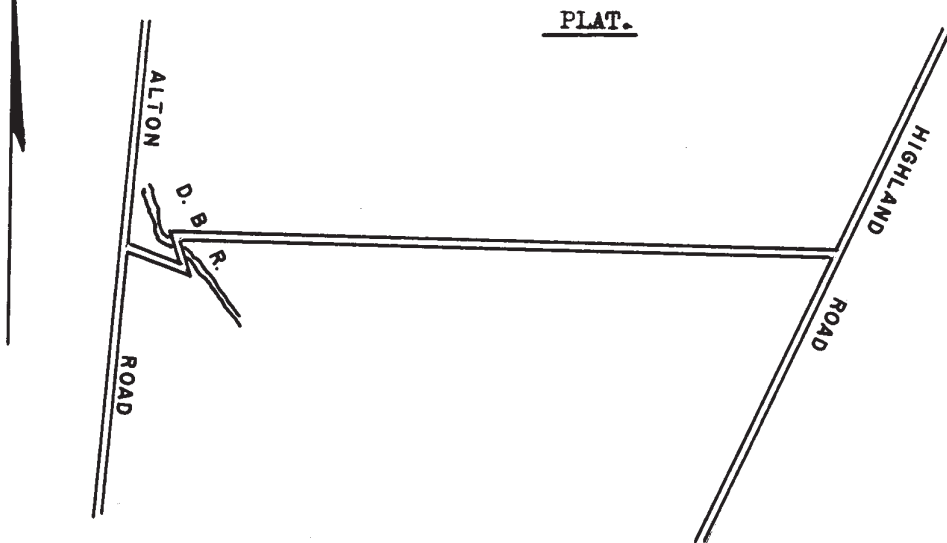

Surveyed a County Road that J. S. Beatty and others petitioned for Commencing at a post in the Center of the Alton Road, bearing North 48 1/4 E. 13 links from a white oak 2 feet in diameter, said post being in the dividing line of Wm. and John S. Beatty. Thence S. 74 1/4 E 63.5 poles to a post on the bank of D. Run: thence N 21 W. 23.55 poles up the run to a post on the west bank of D. Big Run; thence N 21 E 9.428 poles crossing the aforesaid Run to a post on the East Bank of Run; Thence east 742.7 poles to a post in the center of Highland Road, from said post a double white oak Bears N. 52 1/2 W 57 links. May 6th day A. D. 1848.
