To the Honorable the Commissioners of Franklin County, O.

We your petitioners do respectfully ask you to alter a part of the old Delaware Road as follows; beginning where the line of land between Abram P. Smith and Thomas Rees crosses the said old Delaware road thence south along said line to intersect the County Road on the Township line between Plain and Jefferson Townships, it also will be much better ground and shorten the distance of said road, we your petitioners residing in the vicinity of said ask that you will act upon the premises according to law we as in duty bound will ever pray ect. To John Clark, George Ridenhour and Jesse Baughman, Viewers and Archibald Smith, Surveyor;

You have been appointed by the Commissioners of Franklin County to perform the duties prescribed by law, on the petition of Abram P. Smith and others, for an alteration of a certain County Road on the land of said Smith, as follows, Beginning where the line between said Smith and Thomas Reese Crosses the Old Delaware road; thence South along said line to intersect the County road on the Township line between Plain and Jefferson Townships. You will therefore meet at on the 12th day of December 1849 for the purpose herein set forth according to the law in such case made and provided. a Copy of which is hereto annexed.

Archibald Smith, Surveyor

Pursuant to an order from the Commissioners of Franklin County, dated Dec. 3. 1849. we have examined the ground for the alteration of the old Delaware road as petitioned for by Abram P. Smith and others, we do find the distance increased 75 poles if the travel is in direction of the old Delaware road, but if the travel is to Columbus, the distance will be less by 109 poles and said proposed road will be on better ground, we therefore report in favor of said alteration and that said road be but 40 feet wide
