Lee, and Others, to view and survey a route for a County Road in Jackson and Pleasant Townships - Beginning at or near Isaac Bowers on the Loudon Road, thence westwardly in a direct line to the farm occupied by John Mitchell running through said farm, through Thomas Beavers farm to the line between H. S. Mitchell and Jacob Dove, thence with said line through Joshua Fords, thence to Burnets new line, thence west to the Harrisburgh & Columbus Turnpike Road.

You will therefore meet for the above named purpose on the 17th day of June 1850, at Isaac Millers and be governed in all things by the law in such case made and provided, a copy of which is herewith annexed.

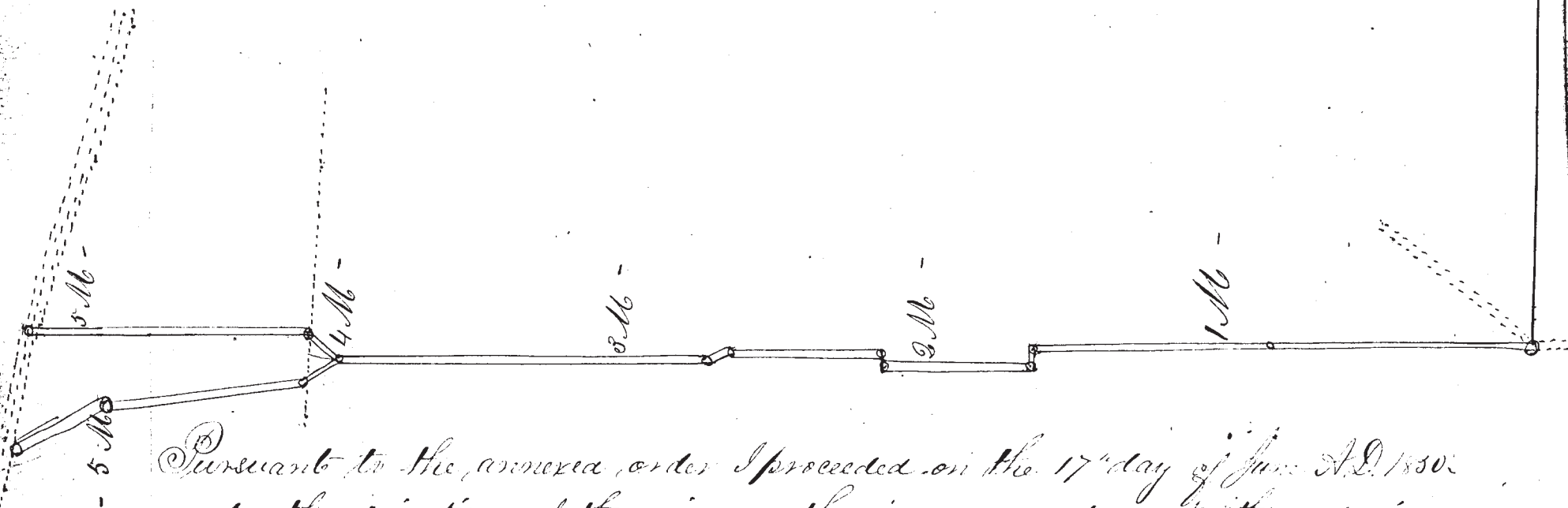

Beginning at a Post in or near the south line of I Barren land in the London Road from which a W oak 2 ft Dia, bears N. 24 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E 51 links distant; thence N 55° 30' W 270 poles to Post Boness S. E. corner; thence N. 89 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W 50 poles to a Post near a White continued same course 187 $\frac{1}{2}$ poles to John D. McComer; thence S 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E 30 poles and 4 links to Post in John Mitchell's East line; thence S 89 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W 107 poles and 16 links to a two Mile Post; continued same course 48 poles and 10 links to a Post; thence N 4 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° W 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ poles to H. S. Mitchell's N. E. corner; thence N. 89° 17' W, 139 poles to H. S. Mitchell's N. W. corner; thence N. 89° 40' W 25 poles to a Post; thence S. 57 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° W 16 poles and 25 links to a Post in the New Barnett line; thence with said line N. 89° W 83 poles and 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ links to a 3 Mile Post; continued same course 330 poles to a Post at three Elms marked 4 miles; thence N 55 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W 36 poles 17 links to D.
