Gentlemen,

The undersigned respectfully petition for the vacation of that part of the Lancaster and Columbus road, as now travelled, which lies between the following points, to wit: From where said road crosses the section line at Edmund Stewart's farm in the north part of Hamilton township in Franklin County to where it intersects the Columbus and Chillicothe turnpike in Montgomery township.

And they also respectfully petition for the location and establishment of a county road to commence at the said Columbus and Chillicothe turnpike where it crosses the south line of the tract of land belonging to the heirs of Moses Merrill dec'd. in Montgomery township, and run east on said line until intersects the Columbus and Grovesport turnpike.

You have been appointed to view

and survey an alteration of a part of the Lancaster Road in Montgomery Township, to wit; for the vacation of that part of the Lancaster Road Columbus Road as now travelled, which lies between the following points, to wit; From where said road crosses the section line at Edmund Stewarts farm in the north part of Hamilton Tp. in Franklin Co. to where it intersects the Columbus and Chillicothe turnpike in Montgomery Township;— and also for the location of a county Road to commence at the said Columbus and Chillicothe Turnpike where it crosses the south line of the tract of land belonging to the heirs of Moses Morrill dec'd in Montgomery Township and run East on said line until it intersects the Columbus and Groesport Turnpike.

You will therefore meet for the above purposes at the house of J. P. Bruck on the 15th day of June 1830 and proceed according to the law annexed hereto

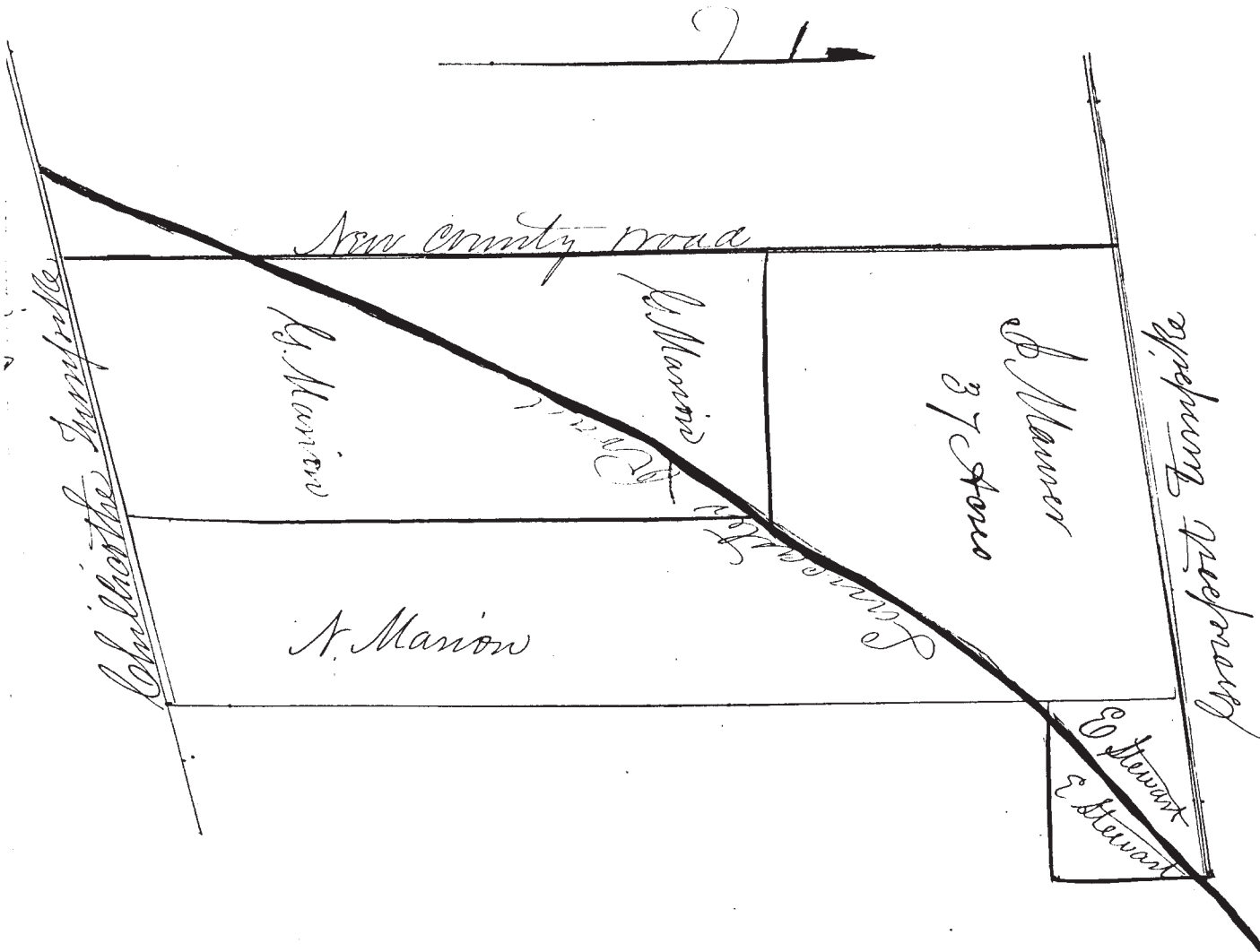

Agreeably to an order to us, directed from your Board in answer to a petition of George Merion and others for an alteration in a county Road; to wit; for the vacation of that part of the Lancaster and Columbus Road as now travelled; which lies between the following points to wit; From where said Road crosses the section line at Edmund Stewarts farm in the north part of Hamilton Tp. in Franklin Co. to where it intersects the Columbus and Chillicothe Turnpike in Montgomery Township, and also for the location of a county Road to commence at the said Columbus and Chillicothe Turnpike where it crosses the south line of the tract of land belonging to the heirs of Moses Morrill dec'd in Montgomery Tp and run East on said line until it intersects the Columbus & Groesport Turnpike Road. We have examined the ground and caused a location of the road as designed by the annexed Plat and survey and are of opinion that said road if established would be of public utility and that forty feet will be sufficient width for said Road.

Pursuant to the annexed order of procedure on the 15th day of June 1850 under the direction of James Walcutt Alonzo Perry and Hiram Richards viewers to make a survey and location of a county road petitioned for by George Marion and others as follows. viz: Beginning at a stake in the turnpike leading from Columbus to Chillicothe where it crosses the south line of the tract of land belonging to the heirs of Moses Morie deceased in Montgomery Township. from thence on said line East 19 3/4 poles to a stake in the Columbus and Groveport turnpike. Courses and distances of Lancaster road to be vacated. Beginning at the section line at Edmund Stewarts farm thence N. 26° W. 58 poles. N. 45° W. 76 poles N. 57 1/2° W. 39 poles. N. 66° W. 87 poles to Columbus and Chillicothe turnpike. Thence with said turnpike S. 5° E. 14 poles to the beginning said new road south 145 poles from where it intersects the Columbus and Groveport turnpike to the old Lancaster road.

I certify the above field notes to be correct as taken by me on the ground, and that the Plat is a true protraction of the same.
