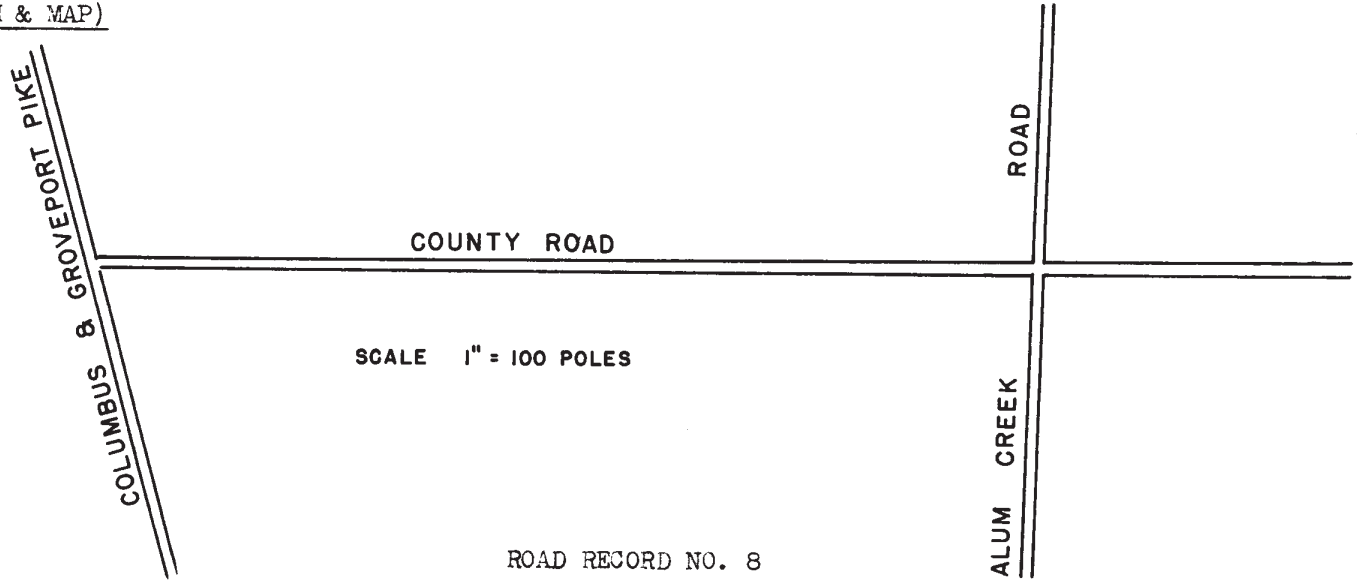

Corner of section 13 in Township 4 of Range 21 Near the House of Michael Koebel, And running thence West along the Section line to the Columbus & Groveport Turnpike and do report favorably to the location for the following reasons. A road can be Made at a reasonable expense it Will be a road of public Utility and do but little private damage, and it Will Continue a County road coming West on the Same Section line in Madison township and We are of Opinion that forty feet in Width is sufficient.
