A.W.TAYLOR'S ROAD IN PLAIN

Be it remembered, that heretofore, to wit: At the September A.D. 1857, of the Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, among other proceedings then and there had, were the following, to wit: September 7th, 1857. A.W. Taylor this day presented a Petition for a New County Road in Township of Plain, in words the following, to wit:

TO THE HONORABLE COMMISSIONERS OF FRANKLIN COUNTY:

The undersigned Citizens of Plain Township respectfully petition your Honorable body for the location of a County road; beginning at a point on the road leading south from John Robbins, Jr. in Plain Township, One Hundred and Ten Rods (110) south of the Section line, in the line between the farms of Davis Trumbo and J.P. Taylor; thence on the due line to the crossing of the Granville road at Sugar Camp Run. Your Petitioners ever bound to pray, &c.

And at the same time came John P. Taylor and made oath in words the following, to wit:

STATE OF OHIO, FRANKLIN COUNTY, SS.-

Personally appeared John P. Taylor, who being duly sworn, deposes that he stuck up three Notices in Plain Township for the location of the road petitioned for by A.W. Taylor and others, and THAT said Notices were up for four consecutive weeks before the first Monday in September A.D. 1857.

Said Notice in form in the following, to wit:

NOTICE.- Many Petitioners will ask the Commissioners of Franklin County, at the September term for a County Road, Commencing in the centre of the road leading South from John Robbins, J. in Plain township one hundred and ten (110) rods south of the Section line, in the line between the farms of Davis Trumbo, J.P. Taylor; thence on a due line through the lands of J.P. & Lorenzo Taylor to the crossing of the Worthington and Granville road at the Sugar Camp Run. August 1st, 1857. Many Petitioners.

And at the same time A.W. Taylor and John P. Taylor gave bond in words the following, to wit: KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That we, A.W. Taylor and John P. Taylor, are held and firmly bound unto the State of Ohio for the use of Franklin County in the just and full sum of One Hundred Dollars, the payment of which, well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves, our heirs, &c, jointly and severally (firmly) by these presents. Witness our hands and seals the seventh day of September A.D. 1857.

The condition of the above obligation is such, That whereas the above bound A.W. Taylor has this day petitioned the County Commissioners for the location of a New County Road in Plain Township. Now if the said A.W. Taylor shall succeed in his petition then this obligation to be void, otherwise to remain in full force.

And afterwards, to wit: On the third day of said session the Commissioners appointed William Campbell, John G. Squires, Theron Lee, Viewers, and W.W. Pollard, Surveyor, on said proposed road.

And thereupon there was issued from the office of County Auditor, the following Order in words the following, to wit:

GENTLEMEN:

The County Commissioners of this County have appointed you to view and survey a route for a New County Road in Plain township as follows: Beginning at a point on the road leading south from John Robbins, Jr., in Plain Township, one hundred and ten rods south of the section line on the line between the farms of Davis Trumbo and John P. Taylor; thence on a due line to the crossing of the Worthington and Granville road, at "Sugar Camp Run".

You will therefore meet at J.P.Taylor's on the 30th day of September at 10 o'clock A.M. A.D. 1857 or within five days thereafter and proceed to view and survey said route, and make due(due) Report thereof to this office, on or before the first Monday in December A.D.1857.

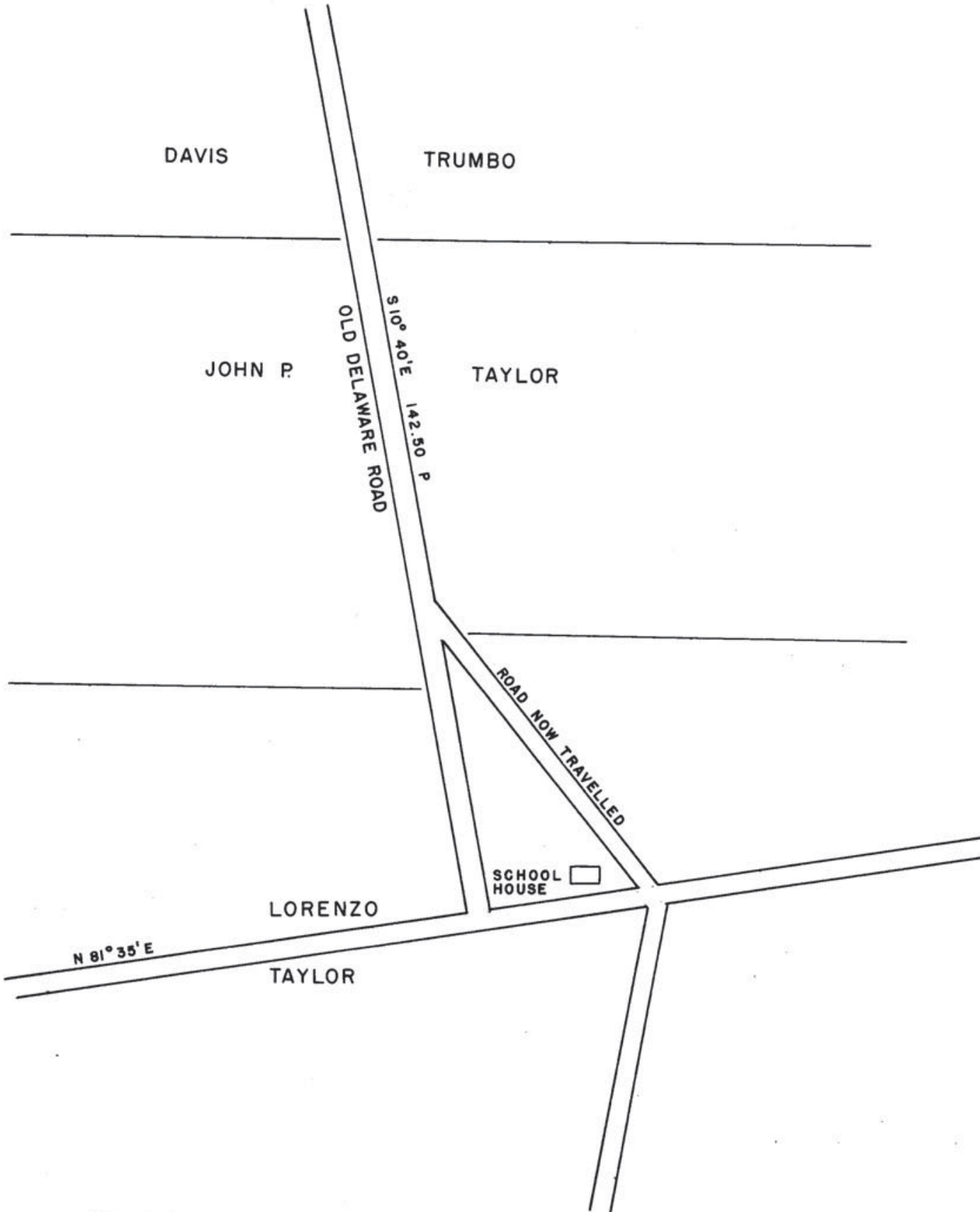

Accompanying the same was a Report of the Viewers and Surveyor in words the following, to wit:

SURVEYORS REPORT

In obedience to the annexed order, I met with William Campbell, John J.Squires and Theron Lee, Viewers named in the said order on the Thirtieth day of September A.D. 1857, at the house of J.P.Taylor; after A.G.Artibus, as chain carriers, William Campbell acting as marker, proceeded to survey and said route for road. Beginning at a state in the centre of the "Old Delaware Road", (so called) - in the line between Davis Trumbo and J.P.Taylor; from which a hickory two feet in diameter bears N.61°-15' W. 37 links distant; and from thence run south 10°-41' E. 142-50/100 poles to stake in the centre of the Worthington and Granville road, and thus ending. Making the distance about eight poles shorter to the Granville road, by the new road, than it is by the one now traveled.

VIEWERS REPORT

To the Commissioners within and for the County of Franklin, State of Ohio;  
GREETINGS:

In pursuance of the annexed Order, we the undersigned Road Viewers named in the said Order, met as above stated by the Surveyor, W.W. Pollard, and after having been qualified, proceeded to view and survey said route for road as prayed for by the Petition, of which the above diagram and description of the Surveyor is a true and faithful representation; and we are well satisfied that a good public highway can be much more easily worked and maintained as now surveyed than where it has heretofore been traveled. We would therefore report in favor of the new route believing that the public convenience would be better accomodated thereby. Damage to George Taylor fifty cents.

And afterwards, to wit: On the third day of said session, said Report was taken up and read the - third time; and no objection being made to the establishment of said road and the Commissioners being of opinion that said road would be of public utility, the same was established in accordance with the Report of the Viewers and Surveyor, the Commissioners to pay the damages.
