

M.L.SULLIVANTS ROAD IN FRANKLIN TOWNSHIP.

Be it remembered that heretofore to wit: at the June session A.D. 1860 of the County Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, and on the first day of said session among other proceedings then and there had the following:

M.L.Sullivant on behalf of himself and 18 others citizens of Franklin Township presented a petition for the establishment of a new County road in said township in words, the following:

TO THE HONORABLE COMMISSIONERS OF FRANKLIN COUNTY; OHIO:

The undersigned petitioners respectfully represent that their interests and convenience require a new county road in Franklin Township, commencing in the Centre of the Harrisburgh turnpike at a point where said road makes an angle, about twenty rods Northeast from the present Toll Gate on said road from thence to run south of west on the line between the Vance and Overton, and the Harrison and Stephenson Survey N. 68°-degrees, 47 min. E. about one mile and thirteen rods, thence N. 15-1/2 deg. West about one Hundred and twenty eight rods to a stake in Sullivants proposed avenue, thence south of West about two hundred and seventy eight rods to a point. Thence to continue west about one mile and a half until it intersects the Georgesville road, there to terminate; and your petitioners therefore pray that the proper and legal steps may be taken to authorize the location and establishment of said road, and will ever pray, &c. Arthur O'Harra, under oath, testified that 12 of the signers resided and were freeholders in the County of the proposed new road.

John M. Pugh, under oath, testified that three notices of which the following is a true copy, were set up in three public places in Franklin township, One in the Coutny Auditors Office, and one published in the Ohio Statesman the time required by law.

ROAD NOTICE.

There will be a petition presented to the Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, at their June session A.D. 1860, praying for the location of a new County road in Franklin township in said County, to wit: Commencing in the centre of the Harrisburgh Turnpike at a point where said road makes an angle, about 20 rods northeast from the present Toll Gate, on said road, from thence to run south of west on the line between the Vance and Overton and the Harrison & Stephenson Survey N. 68°-47'-E. about 1 mile and 13 rods; thence N. 15-1/2°- W. about 128 rods to a stake in Sullivants proposed avenue, thence south of west about 278 rods to a point; thence to continue west about one mile and a half until it intersects the Georgesville road, their to terminate.

M. L. Sullivant & T.J.Kerr entered into bond which was approved by the Commissioners.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That we, M.L.Sullivant and T.J.Kerr, are held and firmly bound unto the State of Ohio for the use of Franklin County in the just and full sum of One Hundred Dollars, the payment of which well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves, our heirs, &c,&c, jointly and severally firmly by these presents. Witness our hands and seals this 4th day of June A.D.1860.

The condition of this obligation is such, That whereas, the above bound M. L. Sullivant has this day petitioned the County Commissioners of Franklin County for the establishment of a County Road, commencing in the centre of the Harrisburgh turnpike at a point where said road makes an angle about twenty rods northeast from the present toll gate on said roaa, from thence to run south of west on the line between the Vance and Overton and the Harrison and Stephenson Surveys N. 68 degrees 47 min. E. about one hundred &- twenty eight rods to a stake in Sullivants proposed avenue, thence south of west about two hundred and seventy eight rods to a point; Thence to continue west about one mile and a half until it intersects the Georgesville road , then to terminate.

Now if the said M.L.Sullivant shall succeed in his said petition then this obligation to be void and of no effect; otherwise to remain in full force in law.

And afterwards, to wit: on the first day of the June Session of the County Commissioners of Franklin County, Jacob Huffman, Samuel Stimmel and Jacob White were appointed viewers, and W. W. Pollard, Surveyor, on the new road petitioned for by M. L. Sullivant and others in Franklin Township.

And afterwards, to wit: on the 14th day of August A.D. 1860 there was issued from the County Auditors Office of Franklin County the following order.

GENTLEMEN: At a regular meeting of the County Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, held at their office June 4th, 1860, you were appointed to view and survey the following route for a new County road in said Franklin County, Commencing in the Centre of the Harrisburgh Turnpike and a point where said makes an angle about twenty rods north-east from the present Tollgate on said road, from Thence to run south of west on the line between the Vance and Overton and the Harrison and Stephenson Survey, N. 68 degrees, 47 minutes E. about one hundred and twenty eight rods to a stake in Sullivants proposed avenue. Thence South of west about two hundred and seventy eight rods to a point; Thence to continue west about one mile and a half until it intersects the Georgesville road; thence to terminate.

You will please meet at the toll gate on the Harrisburgh Turnpike near the green lawn Cemetery on Monday 27th day of August, 1860, or within five days thereafter, and proceed to view and survey said route for a new County road, and make return thereof to this office on or before the first Monday in September, 1860.

SURVEYORS REPORT.

To the Commissioners within and for the County of Franklin, State of Ohio:

In compliance with the mandates of the annexed order, I met with Jacob Huffman, Samuel Stimmel and Jacob White, Viewers named in said order at the time and place named in said order agreeable to notice given, as stated in said Viewers report, and having been duly qualified organized and proceeded to view and survey said route for road - beginning at a state in the centre of the Columbus & Harrisburgh Turnpike, at the angle near the toll-gate; and thence along the line between M.L.Sullivan on the north and Campbell & Searle and George Washington on the south S. 68°-48' W. 336 Poles to a stake in said Sullivan's - and Washington's line; Thence N. 14°-30' W. 135- 40/100 Poles to a stake in Sullivan's Avenue as laid down on said Sullivan's Lithographic map; Thence with the line of said Avenue S. 75°-10' W.278 Poles to an angle in said Avenue at the line between Surveys Nos. 9197 and 2668; Thence S. 85°- W. 672 Poles to a stake in the centre of the Georgesville Road, and there ending; making the whole distance 4 miles, 3 furlongs and 21-1/2 Poles; having set mile posts at each mile out.

VIEWERS REPORT.

To the Commissioners within and for The County of Franklin, State of Ohio:

We the undersigned, Road Viewers, in obedience to the annexed order met with W.W.Pollard, Surveyor, named in said order, at the tollgate in the Harrisburgh Turnpike near the Green Lawn Cemetery in Franklin Township on Monday the 27th day of August, A.D.,1860, and took to our assistance Arthru O'Harra and John Swain for Chain Carriers, and Charles Harrison for marker, and after having been duly qualified, proceeded to view and survey said proposed route for a new County road of which the annexed plat and description of the Surveyor is a true and faithful representation.

We do unanimously report in favor of opening a road on said line as surveyed, believing that the public interest require a road on said line, and we are of the opinion that a good public highway can be made on said line at reasonable expense; and we are also unanimously of the opinion that sixty (60) feet would be suitable width for said road.

We do assess damages in favor of George Washington for land belonging to him that will be made use of in making said road if opened as surveyed on the amount of one \$1.00 dollar, he having filed with us the written Claim for damages.

And afterwards, to wit: on the third day of said session said reports were taken up and read the third time, and the road established in accordance therewith, provided the petitioners pay the damages awarded to George Washington.
