

AARON CHURCH AND OTHERS ALTERATION OF ROAD

LEADING FROM DUBLIN TO PLEASANT VALLEY.

Be it remembered That heretofore, to wit: at the June Session A.D. 1862, of the County Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, and on the 1st day of said session among other proceedings then hand were the following:

A petition presented by Aaron Church and others of Washington was read the first time and laid over.

TO THE (proceedings) COMMISSIONERS OF FRANKLIN COUNTY:

The undersigned freeholders residents of the County of Franklin and of the vicinity of the proposed alteration, herein, respectfully ask that the road leading from Dublin to Pleasant Valley may be altered in manner following, to-wit:

beginning at a point in the centre of said road at a corner common to Luther Lane and Aaron Church & running thence in a westerly direction along their division line to the Northeast corner of said Aaron Churchs Land & continuing in the same direction along the line of said Luther Lane & L. M. Pratt to a point in the centre of said Dublin and Pleasant Valley road, known as a corner common to said Luther Lane and L.M.Pratt, the entire distance being about 14 poles.

BOND.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That we, Aaron Church and James E. Wright, are held and firmly bound unto the State of Ohio for the use of Franklin County in the just and full sum of One Hundred Dollars, the payment of which well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves, our heirs, &c,&c, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents. Witness our hands and seal this 2nd day of June A.D.1862. The condition of this obligation is such, that whereas the above bound Aaron Church has this day petitioned the County Commissioners of Franklin County for an alteration in the road leading from Dublin to Pleasant Valley; said alteration as asked for being entirely within the County of Franklin, Ohio, and particularly described in the petition of said Aaron Church, and duly filed with said County Commissioners.

Now if the said Aaron Church shall succeed his said petition then this obligation to be void and of no effect, otherwise to remain in full force in law.

And afterwards, to wit: at the June session A.D. 1862, and on the third day of said session of the County Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, the following Viewers were appointed on the road petitioned for by Aaron Church and others in Washington Township, Viz: Charles Mitchell, Samuel S. Davis, Wm.B.Hays and Ulrich Lathrop assessor, and are ordered to meet in Dublin on the 20th day of June 1862, and survey and view said road petitioned for by Aaron Church, et al, and report according to law.

THE STATE OF OHIO, FRANKLIN COUNTY.

Be it remembered, on the 30th day of June A.D. 1862, personally came before me Ulrich Lathrop, as Surveyor, and Wm. B.Hays, S.S.Davis and Charles Mitchell, as Viewers, and made Solemn Oath that they would faithfully and impartially discharge their several duties according to law, as surveyor and viewers according to the order of County Commissioners and hereto attached for a view and survey of an alteration in the road leading from Dublin to Pleasant Valley, on the application of Aaron Church and others. VIEWERS REPORT.

In obedience to an order from the Commissioners of Franklin County to view, survey and alter so much of the road leading from Dublin in the County of Franklin to Pleasant Valley in the County of Madison, as mentioned and described in a petition of Aaron Church and others for that purpose.

We the undersigned Viewers after having been duly sworn according to law met at the time and place appointed in said order, and we beg leave to submit the following report of our doings in the premises.

FIRST. We regard the prayer of the said petition as reasonable and recommend the alteration as herein specified.

SECOND. We think the public convenience we be sufficiently and as well promoted by a road fifty feet in width as with one sixty feet in width, we therefore, with the assistance of Ulrich Lathrop, as surveyor, and two suitable Chain Carriers and marker altered said road; and located it entirely on the lands of Aaron Church and L.M.Pratt, they having waived the damages. The construction of said road on their land being as easy and practicable in our opinion as if laid out according to the prayer of the petitioners, with the saving of the value of the Land occupied by said road. The boundaries of the road as altered are as follows: Beginning at a stone in the center of the road leading from Dublin to Pleasant Valley, at a corner common to Luther Lane and Aaron Church, running thence 79°- W. 3 poles to a stake; Thence S. 83°- W. 151 Poles to stake, 8-1/2 poles east of a stone corner to Luther Lane and L.M.Pratt, from which point the road continues N. 88°-W. to the line between Franklin and Madison counties.

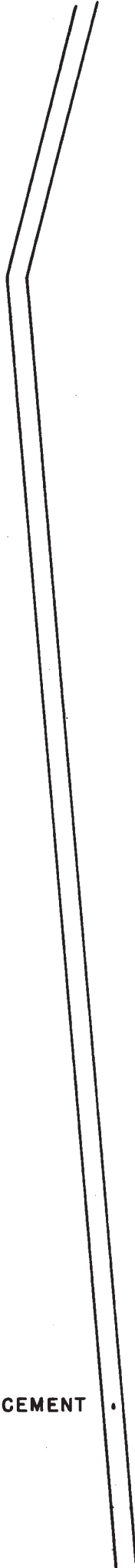
