Is hereby given that a petition will be presented to the Honorable Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, at their next regular session in June for an alteration of a County Road in Mifflin Township, Franklin County, Ohio, on the west side of Big Walnut or Gahanna Road, Commencing at the Northeast Corner of the Grave Yard called the Ridenour "Grave Yard." Thence West about 17 Rods to the West side of said "Grave Yard"; thence South about (12) Rods intersecting the old road at the West side of George Ridenours orchard and their to terminate.

And be it remembered that the County Commissioners at their regular session in June having received satisfactory evidence that the above notice was posted and published according to law, took under consideration the following.

P E T I T I O N .

TO THE COMMISSIONERS OF FRANKLIN CO.,O:

We the residents of Mifflin Township, Franklin Co., Ohio, and of the vicinity of the Ridenour Grave Yard and your Honorable Body to change the Road running through the Grave Yard called the Ridenour Grave Yard, Commencing at the North East Corner of the said Grave Yard; thence West about seventeen (17) Rods to the west side of said Grave Yard; thence south about twelve (12) Rods, intersecting the old road at the west side of George Ridenour orchard and there to terminate.

And the County Commissioners after considering the propriety and convenience of said alteration required the said petitioners to give security, which was acceded to, and Jesse Ridenhour gave said security desired, in the following bond, Viz:

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That we, Jesse Baughman and Jacob Slyh, are held and firmly bound unto the State of Ohio for the use of Franklin County, in the just and full sum of One Hundred Dollars the payment of which well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves, our heirs,&c,&c, jointly and severally firmly by these presents. Witness our hands and seal this 6th day June 1864.

The condition of this obligation is such, That whereas the above bound Jesse Baughman has this day petitioned the County Commissioners of Franklin County to change the road running through the Ridenour Grave Yard, commencing at the Northeast corner of said Grave Yard, thence west about seventeen rods to the west side of said Grave Yard; thence south about twelve rods, intersecting the old road at the west side of G. Ridenour orchard.

Now if the said Jesse Baughman shall succeed in his said petition, then this obligation to be void and of no effect, otherwise to remain in full force in law.

And the above bound being acceptable, the Commissioners there proceeded to appoint Viewers, and on the 1st day of July, 1864, they issued appointments and instructions to George White, Edward Livingston, and E. Cryder as Viewers, and Uriah Lathrop as Surveyor, and ordered them to meet at the house of Jesse Baughman in Gahanna on Saturday the 16th day of July, 1864, at 10 o'clock, which they did, and after following the instruction to make the following.

VIEWERS REPORT.

TO THE HON. COMMISSIONERS OF FRANKLIN COUNTY:

The undersigned Viewers of a County Road petitioned for by Jesse Baughman and others submit the following report. That in pursuance of the order issued to them they with the Surveyor, Uriah Lathrop, met at the time and place specified in said order, and being first duly sworn, proceeded to the discharge of the duties of this appointment and selected and took to their assistance E. Cryder and as chainmen, and also J.Baughman as marker, who were also sworn to discharge the duties of their appointment. That they fixed as the initial point of said alteration a stone at the North East Corner of the Grave Yard near Ridenour and from thence laid out said alteration and cause the same to be surveyed along the following described route running west 17 poles to a stone North West corner of said Grave Yard Lot. Thence South 11 poles, 20 links, to a stone in the Center of the County Road, running West on the Section line being on the route proposed by the petitioners. That they are of opinion that said alteration ought to be made because the public convenience requires it and that a good road can be made along the line surveyed at a trifling expenditure of money and labor. They are further of opinion that the public convenience will be fully subserved if said road is established 33 feet wide. Given under our hands this 22nd day of July 1864.

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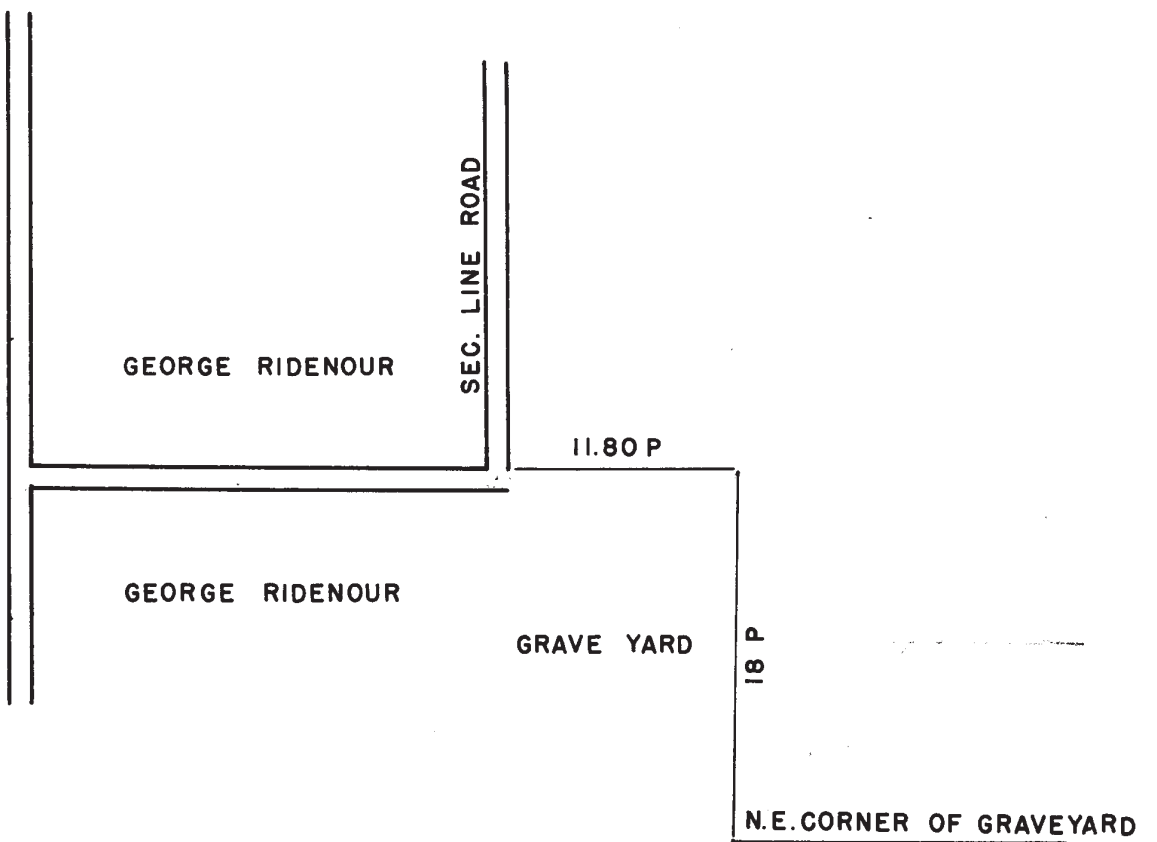
TO THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF FRANKLIN CO.,O:

The undersigned Uriah Lathrop in obedience to your order of July 1st, 1864, and directed to George White, Edward Livingston, and E. Cryder, Viewers and myself as surveyor proceeded in company with and under the direction of said Viewers having - first been sworn according to law and taken to my assistance E. Cryder as chainman and J. Baughman as marker and administered to them the proper oath proceeded to survey and mark the road as directed by said Viewers, as follows, to-wit: Beginning at a stone at N.E. Corner of the Grave Yard Lot near the bank of Big Walnut and thence run West 17 poles to a stone at the N.W. corner of said Grave Yard Lot; thence S. 11 poles and 20 links to a stone in the center of the County road running west on the section Line as will more fully appear by reference to the foregoing plat and field notes, and I hereby certify that said plat is a correct representation of said road from actual survey made on the ground on the 22nd day of July, 1864.
