SAMUEL DOYLE'S ROAD IN CLINTON TOWNSHIP.

TO THE HONORABLE, THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF FRANKLIN, AND STATE OF OHIO:

The petitioners of the Subscribers citizens of Franklin County respectfully represent that it would be greatly to the benefit of the public, and to the benefit of the inhabitants of said vicinity to have located a County Road, to be run as follows: Commencing at a point in the Center of Summit Avenue and Montgomery Street; thence Northerly through Hyers Subdivision of lands in Clinton Township to the North line of H.T.Chittendens' land in Clinton Township; thence North degree to a point in lands belonging to William Neil, about two hundred feet North East of Barn on said William Neil's land; thence Northerly parallel with the section line to the North line of Samuel Doyle's land.

Your petitioners would further represent that the location of said road, would be of a great benefit and utility to the travelling public at large and your petitioners will ever pray, etc.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That a petition will be presented to the Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, at their next regular meeting to be held on Monday the 7th day of December, A.D. 1868, for locating and establishing a County Road to run, as follows, to-wit: Commencing at a point in the center of Summit Avenue and Montgomery Street; thence northerly through Hyers Subdivision of lands in Clinton Township to the North line of H.T.Chittenden land in Clinton Township; thence north degrees to a point in the lands belonging to William Neil, about two hundred feet north east of barn on said William Neil's land; thence northerly parallel with the section line to the north line of Samuel Doyle's land.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS.

Page. I.

That we, Samuel Doyle, G.S. Deming, and Alex Shattuck, are held and firmly bound unto the State of Ohio, for the use of Franklin County, in the just and full sum of One hundred Dollars, the payment of which will and truly to be made, we bind ourselves, our heirs, etc, etc, jointly and severally, firmly, by these presents.

Witness our hands and seal this 7th day of December, A.D. 1868

THE CONDITIONS OF THIS OBLIGATION IS SUCH, That Whereas, the above bound Samuel Doyle, has this day petitioned the County Commissioners of Franklin County for a County road, commencing at a point in the Center of Summit Avenue and Montgomery Street; thence Northerly through Hyers Subdivision of lands in Clinton Township, to the North line of H.T.Chittenden's land in Clinton Township; thence North degrees to a point in lands belonging to William Neil about two hundred feet North East of Barn on said William Neil's land; thence northerly parallel with the Section line to the North line of Samuel Doyle's land.

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Now, if the said Samuel Doyle shall succeed in his said petition, then this obligation to be void; and of no effect; otherwise to remain in full force in law.

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VIEWERS AND SURVEYOR APPOINTED.

BE IT KNOWN, That on this Seventh day of December, A.D. 1868, the Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, appointed Daniel M.Slyh, Rudolph Pheneger and T.M.Hess Viewers and W.P.Brown Surveyor, to view and survey said road in accordance with the petition, and that said viewers and Surveyor meet at the Office of G.S.Deming in Clinton Township on Monday December 28, A.D. 1868 at ten o'clock A.M. and make their report in writing in accordance with the law in such case made and provided.

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VIEWERS REPORT.

TO THE HON. BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, OF FRANKLIN COUNTY, OHIO:

Gentlemen: We, the undersigned, Viewers of a County road petitioned for Samuel Doyle and others, Submit the following report: That in pursuance of the order issued to them, they with W.P. Brown, the Surveyor of said road met at the time and place, specified in said order, to-wit: Esquire Deming's Office on Monday the 28th day of December, A.D. 1868 at ten o'clock A.M., and being first duly sworn, proceeded to the discharge of the duties of their appointments; That they selected and took to their assistance Thomas M. Hess and Daniel M. Slyh as Chain Carriers & Rudolph Pheneger as Marker who were severally sworn to discharge the several duties of their appointment.

That they fix as the initial point of said road, a stake in center of Montgomery Street and Summit Avenue on the line between Montgomery and Clinton Townships and then cause said road to be surveyed and laid out along the following route, to-wit: Thence N 1° 35' E on the center line of said Avenue 116 poles to north line of John Hyers Subdivision of lands in South East quarter of Tp. I Sec. 4 Range 18, U.S.M. Lands; thence continued same course on center line of Summit Avenue 72.44 poles through H.T. Chittenden's Subdivision to stake at 188.44 poles; thence N 7° 10' E 67.56 poles to North line of William Dennison's--continued same course 62 16/100 poles to stake at 318 16 poles about 200 feet North East of Barn on William Neil's land; thence N 1° 10' E 203.04 poles to North line of Wm. Neil's land. Thence continued same course 100.62/100 poles through land of Samuel Doyle to a stake in center of County road at end of distance 621 82 poles to a point of termination making the total length 1 94/100 miles.

Being as near the route proposed as in the opinion of the undersigned a good road can be made along the line surveyed at a trifling expenditure of money and labor, except one or two Streams to cross, and they are of the opinion that said road be located and established as laid out and that the necessities of the public requires it and they are further of opinion that the public convenience will be fully subserved if said road be established sixty feet in width.

SURVEYOR'S REPORT.

TO THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF FRANKLIN COUNTY, OHIO:

The undersigned W.P. Brown in obedience to your order dated December 7th. A.D. 1868, and directed to Daniel M. Slyh, Rudolph Pheneger and Thomas M. Hess Viewers and myself as Surveyor, proceeded in company with and under the direction of said Viewers, having first been sworn according to law, and taking to my assistance Daniel M. Slyh and Thomas M. Hess as Chainmen, and Rudolph Pheneger as Marker, and administered to them the proper oath proceeded to survey and mark the road as directed by said Viewers, as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a stake in center of Montgomery and Summit Streets on the line between Montgomery and Clinton Townships. Thence N 1° 35' E 116 poles to North line of John Hyers Subdivision of lands in Sec. 4 Tp. I R 18 U.S.M lands. Thence continued same course 72 44 poles through H.T. Chittenden's Sub'd to stake at distance 188.44 poles. Thence N 7° 10' E 67.56 poles to north line of William Dennison's land. Thence same course 62 16/100 poles to stake at 318 16 poles being about 200 feet North East of Wm Neil's barn. Thence continued same course 100 62 poles to a stake in center of County road the point of termination (SEE PLAT AT END OF RECORD )

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Making the whole distance, Six hundred and twenty one and 82/100 poles or 1 94/100 miles. So will more fully appear by reference to the plat and field notes hereto attached, and hereby make a part of this report; and I hereby certify that said plat is a correct representation of said road from actual survey made on the ground on the 28th day of December 1868.
