Gantz has this day petitioned the County Commissioners of Franklin County for the alteration in the County road known as the Howard road, commencing at the northeast corner of George Alkire's land; thence through the lands of Wm. Chambers, Jessie Alkire and Wm. Watts to intersect the Columbus and Harrisburgh pike on the south side of Big Run near A.G. Hibbs gate.

Now, if the said H.C. Gantz shall succeed in his petition then this obligation to be void and of no effect; otherwise to remain in full force in Law.

VIEWERS AND SURVEYOR APPOINTED.

BE IT KNOWN, That on the 16th day of June, A.D. 1870, the Commissioners appointed J.K. Lowe, Joel Searles and John Stimmel Viewers and Josiah Kinnear Surveyor, to view and survey said road in accordance with said petition and that said Viewers and Surveyor meet at Jesse Alkire's house on the 16th day of June, A.D. 1870 at 10 o'clock A.M., and make their report in writing in accordance with the law in such case made and provided.

REPORT OF VIEWERS.

TO THE HON. BOARD OF FRANKLIN COUNTY COMMISSIONERS:

The undersigned Viewers of a County road petitioned for by H.C. Gantz and others, submit the following report. That in pursuance of the order issued to them, they with Josiah Kinnear Surveyor of said road met at the time and place specified in said order, to-wit: At Jesse Alkire's house on the 16th day of June, A.D. 1870, at 10 o'clock A.M., and being first duly sworn, proceeded to the discharge of the duties of their appointment. That they selected and took to their assistance Albert Brown and David Stranahan as Chain Carriers and Jesse Alkire as Marker, who were sworn to discharge the duties of their several appointments. That they fixed as the initial point of said road or alteration a stake witnessed by a double Black Walnut tree which bears from said stake N 14° E 18 links distant, and starting thence laid out said road or alteration and caused the same to be surveyed along the following described route; Beginning at the above named point, thence S 80 1/4° E through land of W.T. Chambers, Jesse Alkire and Wm. Watt 175.80 poles to the center of the Harrisburgh pike being as near the route proposed by the petitioners as in the opinion of the undersigned a good road can be made at a reasonable expense taking into consideration the utility, convenience and expense which will result to individuals as well as the public, if said road or any part thereof should be established, that they are of the opinion that said road ought to be established because the public convenience requires it and a good road can be made along the line surveyed at a trifling expenditure of money and labor. They further report that the public convenience will be fully subserved if said road is established forty five feet in width.

The Viewers of the County road petitioned for by A.C. Gantz and others further report that the following named persons presented their written application for compensation and damages by reason of the location of said road over their premises, to-wit: Jesse Alkire and William Watts. That having carefully examined the route of said road over the land of said claimants they do award and determine that compensation be made to said claimants for the property sought to be appropriated as follows; To Jesse Alkire in the sum of One Hundred and forty seven and fifty one hundredths dollars. To Wm. Watt in the sum of One Hundred and twelve and fifty one Hundredth dollars all of which assessments are made without deduction for benefit to any property of said owners on account of the location of said road. They do also assess and determine that the following sum be paid to Wm. Watts for the injury or damages which his tract will sustain by reason by reason of the location of said road through the same to W. Watts in the sum of One Hundred and sixty two dollars and fifty cents in which his premises will be rendered less valuable by such location. The other Claimant is not entitled to the payments of incidental damages as his property is not damaged nor rendered less valuable by the laying out of said road through the same.

They further report that Jesse Alkire should have the privilege of making a cattle way through said road, if he wishes on his farm. They further report that the County ought to pay the damages and compensation awarded to the claimants.
