Notice is hereby given that a petition will be presented to the Commissioners of Franklin County, at their next session December 28, 1912, praying for the Vacation of County Roads on the following lines, to-wit: Being all that part of Arcadia Avenue beginning at its intersection with the west line of Sixth Street and continuing westerly a distance of 304 ft. to the east line of the right of way of The Columbus, Sandusky & Hocking Railway; also all that part of Indianola Boulevard beginning at the west line of its intersection with Sixth Street and continuing westerly a distance of 278.86 ft., to the east line of the right-of-way of The Columbus, Sandusky and Hocking Railway, as shown in the Plat of East Glen Echo Subdivision, as recorded in Plat Book #9, page 28, Recorder's Office, Franklin County, Ohio. COUNTY ROAD PETITION.

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS,
OF FRANKLIN COUNTY, OHIO.

Gentlemen:-

We, the undersigned, The North Columbus Lumber Company, being a majority in interest of the proprietors of land adjoining on either side of the public roads or alleys hereinafter described and heretofore dedicated by private persons to public use, do hereby respectfully petition your Honorable Board to vacate all that part of Arcadia Avenue beginning at its intersection with the west line of Sixth Street and continuing westerly a distance of 304 ft. to the east line of the right of way of The Columbus, Sandusky & Hocking Railway; also all of that part of Indianola Boulevard beginning at the west line of its intersection with Sixth Street, and continuing westerly a distance of 278.86 ft. to the east line of the right of way of The Columbus, Sandusky & Hocking Railway, as shown in the plat of East Glen Echo Sub-division, as recorded in Plat Book #9, page 28, Recorder's Office, Franklin County, Ohio. All of the lots or lands abutting or adjoining said parts of said roads or alleys the vacation of which is herein prayed for, are now owned by the petitioner, and it is the purpose of the petitioner to use same for manufacturing purposes, thus doing away with the further necessity of maintaining that part of said roads or alleys herein described.

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In the matter of the petition of The North Columbus Lumber Co. for the vacation of certain streets or roads in the East Glen Echo Sub-division, Clinton Township, Mr. Humphreys as a member of the Board, offered the following preamble and resolution, and moved the adoption of the same, which was duly seconded by Mr. Sinclair.

WHEREAS, The North Columbus Lumber Co. did on the 28th day of December, 1912, file a petition with the Board, praying for the vacation of a part of two certain roads or streets described therein as follows: being all that part of Arcadia Avenue, beginning at its intersection with the west line of Sixth Street and continuing westerly a distance of 304 feet to the east line of the right of way of The Columbus Sandusky and Hocking Railway; also all of that part of Indianola Boulevard, beginning at the west line of its intersection with Sixth Street and continuing westerly a distance of 278 and 86/100 feet to the east line of the right of way of The Columbus, Sandusky and Hocking Railway, as shown on the plat of East Glen Echo Sub-division, as recorded in Plat Book #9, page 28, Recorder's Office, Franklin County, Ohio; and

WHEREAS, Said roads or street were dedicated by private persons to public use and the said, The North Columbus Lumber Co., being the owners and proprietors of all the lands adjoining said roads or streets sought to be vacated; and

WHEREAS, Thirty days' notice by advertisement in a newspaper published and of general circulation in Franklin County, has been given, and that due notice has been given by posting proper notices in the Township in which said roads or streets are located; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Commissioners is satisfied that no injustice will be done to any person or persons by vacating the said roads or streets; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, By the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, that all of that part of said roads or streets described in said petition, to-wit: all that part of Arcadia Avenue beginning at its intersection with the west line of Sixth Street and continuing westerly a distance of 304 feet to

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the east line of the right of way of The Columbus, Sandusky and Hocking Railway; also all of that part of Indianola Boulevard beginning at the west line of its intersection with Sixth Street and continuing westerly a distance of 278 and 86/100 feet to the east line of the right of way of The Columbus, Sandusky and Hocking Railway, as shown on the plat of East Glen Echo Sub-division, Clinton Township, Franklin County, Ohio, as recorded in Plat Book #9, page 28, Recorder's Office, Franklin County, Ohio, be, and the same are hereby vacated, as provided in sections 7464 and 7465 of the general Code of Ohio; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That all costs and expenses accruing and having accrued under this petition shall be paid by the petitioners.
