

This road record entry is a combination of the original road record book found in the Franklin County Engineer's Tax Map Department and the WPA transcribed road record book found in the Franklin County Engineer's Records Department. The WPA information was added to the original record to aid in reading the text or plats.

The information below refers to the WPA transcribed entries and was included in the front of each of those books:

The undersigned petitioners, resident freeholders of said County, residing in the vicinity of the proposed improvement hereinafter described, respectfully represent that the public convenience requires the laying out and establishing of a county road on the line hereinafter described; and pray that your body will institute and order proper proceedings in the premises to lay out and establish such road, to-wit: Beginning in the center of the Thomas Hendren Road in Madison Township, Franklin County, Ohio, and on the Section line at the farm line running north and south between the lands of Eldora E. Young and Charles Klamforth; thence westerly on said Section line so that the said Section line will be the center of said proposed road, about seventy-six rods to the point on said section line where the present public road runs north and south thru the lands of Frank E. Wildermuth and there terminating, and your petitioners ask that said road be laid out and established 40 feet in width.

The Condition of the above Obligation is such, that, Whereas, application has been made to the Board of County Commissioners of said Franklin County, for the laying out and establishing of a county road on the following line, to-wit: Beginning in the center of the Thomas Hendren Road in Madison Township, Franklin County, Ohio, and on the section line at the farm line running north and south between the lands of Eldora E. Young and Charles Klamforth; thence westerly on said Section line so that the said Section line will be the center of said proposed road, about 76 rods to the point on said section line where the present public road runs north and south thru the lands of Frank E. Wildermuth and there terminating. And said petitioners ask that said road be laid out and established 40 feet wide.

Now if the said applicants shall pay into the Treasury of said county, the amount of all costs and expenses accruing thereon in case the application fails then this obligation to be void; otherwise to remain in full force and virtue in law.

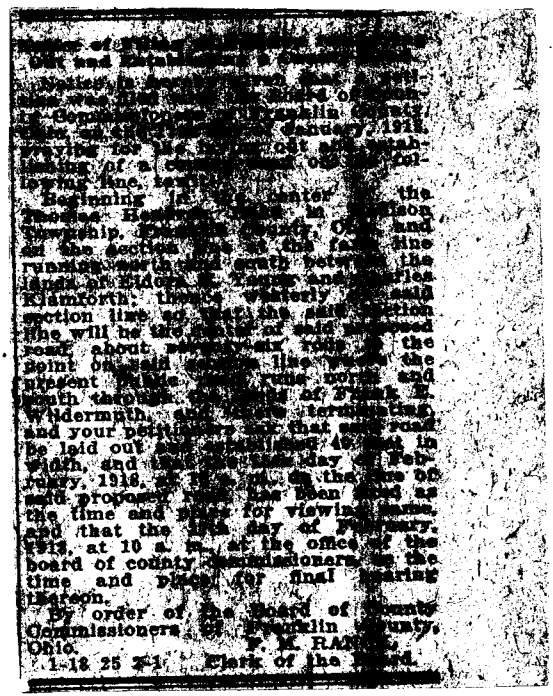

In the matter of the application by petition of Samuel Stukey and others for the laying out and establishing of a county road described therein, filed in the office of county commissioners on the 17th day of January, 1918, Mr. Miller offered the following preamble and resolution, and moved the adoption of the same, which was duly seconded by Mr. Mulby.

WHEREAS, On the 17th day of January, 1918, Samuel Stukey and others filed with the board of county commissioners, a petition signed by at least twelve freeholders of the county residing in the vicinity of the proposed road, as required by provisions of section 6862 General Code of Ohio; and

WHEREAS, On the 17th day of January, 1918, the board of county commissioners did fix the 15th day of February, 1918, at 10 A.M. on the line of said proposed improvement as the time and place for viewing same, and did further fix the 27th day of February, 1918, at 10 A.M., at the office of the board of county commissioners as the time and place for final hearing thereon; and

WHEREAS, Legal notice by publication in The Ohio State Journal, a newspaper published in and having general circulation in Franklin County, Ohio, was given of the time and place for the view of said road, and of the time and place for final hearing thereon; and

WHEREAS, The board of county commissioners did, on the 15th day of February, 1918, the day fixed for viewing said road, meet at the beginning of said road as described in the petition, and heard all proof offered by any of the parties affected by said improvement, and other per-

sons competent to testify, and did go over and along the line of said proposed improvement, and by actual view of the same, and the premises along and adjacent thereto which are to be benefited thereby do find that said proposed improvement is of sufficient public importance as to require that the county surveyor be instructed and directed to make a plat and survey of the same; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, By the board of commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, that the county surveyor be and he hereby is instructed and directed to make a plat and survey of the proposed road improvement, and make report in writing to the board of county commissioners on or before 10 A.M. of February 27th, 1918; said report shall set forth the opinion of said surveyor either for or against the granting of such proposed improvement, and shall be accompanied with a statement of the estimated compensation and damages due each person, firm or corporation whose land is to be taken if the proposed improvement is established; said report shall state also the width to which said road shall be opened, which shall be not less than 30 feet, and it shall recommend any changes in the improvement petitioned for which in the judgment of the surveyor should be made, which report, together with the plat and survey of the improvement shall be deposited with the county commissioners.

February 27, 1918.

In the matter of the petition of Samuel Stukey and others for the establishment of a county road, this being the day fixed for final hearing on the engineer's report, the said engineer not being prepared to file his report, on motion by Mr. Miller, seconded by Mr. Mulby, further consideration thereof and action thereon was postponed until 10 A.M., Wednesday, March 6, 1918.

March 6, 1918.

Pursuant to former adjournment, the matter of final hearing on establishment of road petitioned for by Samuel Stukey and others came on, and after the surveyor of Franklin County, Ohio, filed his report thereon, on motion by Mr. Miller, seconded by Mr. Douglass, further consideration thereof and action thereon was postponed to Wednesday, March 13, 1918, at 10 A.M.

Voting Aye thereon; Douglass and Miller. Absent and not voting, Mulby.

March 13, 1920.

On motion of Mr. Miller, seconded by Mr. Mulby, the matter of hearing engineer's report for the establishment of Stukey Road was postponed to March 20, 1918 at 10 A.M. for further consideration and action thereon.

March 20, 1918.

On motion by Mr. Miller, seconded by Mr. Mulby, further consideration of and action on final hearing in matter of petition filed by Samuel Stukey and others for the establishment of a certain road, was postponed to Wednesday, April 3, 1918, at 10 A.M.

April 3, 1918.

In the matter of the application of Samuel Stukey and others for the laying out and establishing of a county road described therein, filed January 17, 1918, and this being the day fixed by former adjournment, Mr. Miller offered the following preamble and resolution, and moved the adoption of the same, which was duly seconded by Mr. Mulby.

WHEREAS, On the 16th day of February, 1918, the board of county commissioners did, by resolution duly adopted, authorize and direct the surveyor of Franklin County, Ohio, to make report in writing to the Board on or before 10 A.M., of February 27, 1918; said report to be in manner and form set forth and required by section 6865 General Code; and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to adjournment from time to time, on March 6, 1918, R. S. Blackford, Deputy County Surveyor, made report thereon in words and figures as follows:-

"Columbus, Ohio, March 6, 1918. To the Honorable Board of County Commissioners, Franklin County, Ohio. Gentlemen:- As directed by your Board February 16, 1918, I herewith submit survey and plat for laying out and establishing of the Samuel Stukey et al Road, petitioned for January 17, 1918, and viewed by your Board February 15, 1918. Attached is a statement of the estimated compensation and damages due each person whose land is affected in the location and establishment of the road.

The beginning of the road should be extended east to a point about six hundred and eighty feet west of the southwest corner of the Madison Township school section which is also the beginning of the T. Hendron road heretofore established and recorded in Road Record Book No. 7, page 63 County Auditor's office, Columbus, Ohio. The terminus of the road should be extended south and southwest to the Hocking Valley Railroad. These two changes, I believe should be made so as to make the road continuous and not have a short stretch of narrow roadway at either end which has no established width or official status.

I recommend that the road be established sixty feet wide. This road is the connecting link between two roads heretofore established sixty feet wide, as it is the continuation of the T. Hendron road, and really takes the place of a part of the Bixby Road, both of which were laid out sixty feet in width. The capacity for travel over the road as a whole should not be limited by narrowing a small part, either all of the road should be made narrow, if it is too wide, or this part of the road should conform with the rest of the road as already established. Furthermore, a modern improvement of a public road in accordance with the importance of the travel to be expected on this road in the future would require more than forty feet in width for its construction.

I recommend that the center line of the road be established according to the following description: Beginning at a point on the section line about six hundred and eighty feet west of the southwest corner of the Madison Township school section; thence west with the section line 697.50 feet to a stone at the southwest corner of 37.34 acre tract of Eldora E. Young and the southeast corner of the 85.981 acre tract of Chas. J. and Sophia Klamforth; thence in a westerly direction with a deflection angle to the left 0 degree 32' 653.5 feet to an iron pin twenty-four feet south of the section line; thence with a deflection angle of 32' to the right and parallel to the section line and twenty-four feet therefrom 475.7 feet to an iron pin; thence south in a line at right angles to the section line 329.3 feet to an iron bolt; thence with a deflection angle 56 degrees 11½' to the right 156.8 feet to an iron bolt in the east right of way of the Hocking Valley railroad and there to terminate.

The center line location was made after careful consideration of all issues involved. In conclusion I would recommend that the road be located and established as herein set forth. Yours very respectfully, R.S. Blackford, Deputy County Surveyor."

WHEREAS, The board of county commissioners finds that the public utility and welfare require the establishment of said road as described in the petition, except that the beginning

of he road should be extended east to a point about six hundred and eighty feet west of the south-west corner of the Madison Township school section which is also the beginning of the T. Hendron road heretofore established and recorded in Road Record Book No. 7, page 63, County Auditor's of fice, Columbus, Ohio; The terminus of the road should be extended south and southwest to the Hock- ing Valley Railroad, as shown on plat submitted with surveyor's report, and to be established forty (40) feet wide, twenty (20) feet wide on either side of the section line on the east and west road, and fifty (50) feet wide for the north and south road from the section line south; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, By the board of county commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, that said road as prayed for in the petition, with changes above mentioned, be and the same is hereby found and declared to be of sufficient public importance as to cause the establishment of the same; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the 24th day of April, 1918, at 10 A.M., be, and the same is here- by fixed as the time and the office of the board of county commissioners, the place for hearing claims for compensation and damages, and that all claims for compensation and damages shall be filed with the board on or before time of said hearing; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That notice of such time and place of hearing such claim shall be served on the owner or owners personally or by leaving a copy of the same at the usual place of residence of such owner or owners, at least five days before the time fixed for said hearing, and that the clerk of the board shall cause such notice to be given and make due report thereon, as provided in section 6870 General Code.

Thereupon appellants duly filed herein their motion for new which, being argued by counsel and submitted to the Court on consideration thereof, is held by the Court not well taken, and it is hereby ordered that the same be, and is hereby overruled.

It is, therefore, ordered, adjudged and decreed that said findings and said verdict be, and the same are hereby approved and confirmed, and the Court finds in favor of said road improvement as established by the order of the County Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio.

Thereupon this cause came on further to be heard upon questions touching the taxing of the costs herein, and it appearing that the sum thus assessed in favor of the said Chas. J. 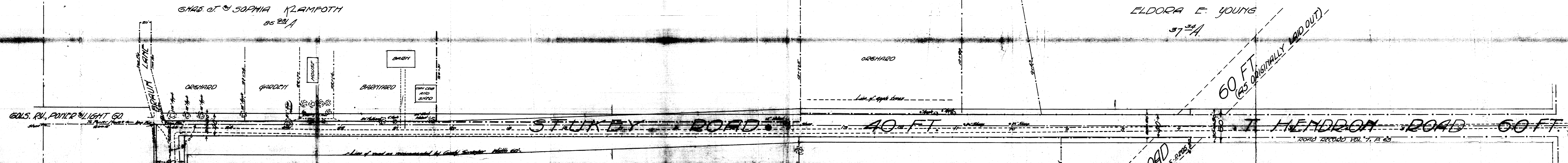

BE IT RESOLVED, By the board of commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, that the full amount of compensation and damages, to-wit: the sum of \$265.00, allowed by decree of the Probate Court of Franklin County, Ohio, in the matter of the establishment of said road, be and the same is hereby allowed and ordered paid from the general expense fund of the county; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Trustees of Madison Township, Franklin County, Ohio, be and they hereby are authorized and directed to cause said Stukeley Road to be opened to public travel in a manner described in the petition, except that the beginning of the road should be extended east to a point about six hundred and eighty feet west of the southwest corner of the Madison Township school section which is also the beginning of the T. Hendron road heretofore established and recorded in Road Record Book No. 7, page 63, County Auditor's office, Columbus, Ohio; the terminus of the road should be extended south and southwest to the Hocking Valley Railroad, as shown on plat submitted with surveyor's report, and to be established forty (40) feet wide, twenty (20) feet wide on either side of the section line on the east and west road, and fifty (50) feet wide for the north and south road from the section line south, and shall thereafter be a public road to be kept, maintained and improved as provided by law; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a record of the proceedings and the plat and survey be entered upon the road records of Franklin County, Ohio; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the county surveyor of Franklin County, Ohio, be and he hereby is directed to plainly indicate the true line of said road upon the request of the property owners along the said line, or upon request of the Trustees of Madison Township; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be, and the same is hereby directed and ordered mailed to the Trustees of Madison Township, Franklin County, Ohio.
