

This road record entry is a combination of the original road record book found in the Franklin County Engineer's Tax Map Department and the WPA transcribed road record book found in the Franklin County Engineer's Records Department. The WPA information was added to the original record to aid in reading the text or plats.

Filed Sept. 15, 1920.

To the Board of Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio:

The undersigned petitioners, resident freeholders of said County, residing in the vicinity of the proposed improvement hereinafter described, respectfully represent that the public convenience requires the laying out and establishing of a County Road on the line hereinafter described; and pray that your body will institute and order proper proceedings in the premises to lay out and establish such road, to-wit: Beginning at the intersection of the north line of Section 3 and the Kidner-Taylor Pike (Road No. 142); thence westerly with the north line of said Section No. 3 a distance of about 6800 feet to the Township line; thence continuing westerly in Blendon Township with the north line of Section No. 4 a distance of about 1440 ft. to the D. Ulry Road (Road No. 150) and there to terminate, being about 1.56 miles in length and being 1.29 miles in Plain Township and 0.27 miles in Blendon Township.

PETITIONER'S BOND

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That we, T A Warner, W E Caldwell, Gilbert James and John Glass, are held and firmly bound unto the State of Ohio, for the use and benefit of Franklin County, in the penal sum of Two Hundred Dollars, to the payment of which, well and truly to be made, we do hereby jointly and severally bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and administrators.

Signed by us and dated at Columbus, Ohio, this 15th day of September, 1920.

The condition of the above obligation is such, that whereas, application by petition has been made to the County Commissioners of said Franklin County, for the establishing of a Public Road; the following being the route and termini thereof: Beginning in Plain Township at the intersection of the north line of Section 3 and the Kidner-Taylor pike (Road No. 142); thence westerly with the north line of said Section No. 3 a distance of about 6800 feet to the township line; thence continuing westerly in Blendon Township with the north line of Section No. 4 a distance of about 1440 feet to the D. Ulry Road (Road No. 150) and there to terminate, being about 1.56 miles in length and being 1.29 miles in Plain Township and 0.27 miles in Blendon Township. Now, if the said petitioners will pay into the Treasury of said County, the costs and expenses incurred in the proceedings for such improvement, in case the prayer of such petition be not granted then this obligation to be void, otherwise to be in full force in law.

In the matter of the application by petition by T. A. Warner and others, for the establishment of a county road described therein, filed in the office of the board of county commissioners on the 15th day of September, 1920, Mr. Scott offered the following preamble and resolution and moved the adoption of the same, which was duly seconded by Mr. Barthman.

WHEREAS, On the 15th day of September, T. A. Warner and others filed with the board of county commissioners, a petition signed by at least twelve free holders of the county residing in the vicinity of the proposed road, as required by provisions of section 6862 General Code of Ohio; and

WHEREAS, On the 20th day of September, 1920, the board of county commissioners did fix the 14th day of October, 1920, at 10 A.M., on the line of said proposed road improvement as the time

and place for viewing same, and did further fix the 6th day of November, 1920, at 10 A.M. at the office of the board of county commissioners as the time and place for final hearing thereon; and

WHEREAS, Legal notice by publication in The Ohio State Journal, a newspaper published in and having general circulation in Franklin County, Ohio, was given of the time and place for the view of said road, and of the time and place for final hearing thereon; and

WHEREAS, The board of county commissioners did, on the 14th day of October, 1920, the day fixed for viewing said road, meet at the beginning of said road as described in the petition, and heard all proof offered by any of the parties affected by said improvement, and other persons competent to testify, and did go over and along the line of said proposed improvement, and by actual view of the same, and the premises along and adjacent thereto which are to be benefited thereby do find that said proposed improvement is of sufficient importance to require that the county surveyor be instructed and directed to make a plat and survey of the same; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, BY the board of commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, that the county surveyor be, and he hereby is instructed and directed to make a plat and survey of the proposed road improvement, and make report in writing to the board of county commissioners on or before 10 A.M. of Saturday, November 6, 1920; said report shall set forth the opinion of said surveyor either for or against the granting of such proposed improvement; shall contain the name of each person, firm or corporation whose land is to be taken if the proposed improvement is established; said report shall state also the width to which said road shall be opened, which shall be not less than thirty feet, and it shall recommend any changes in the improvement petitioned for which in the judgment of the surveyor should be made, which report, together with the plat and survey of the improvement shall be deposited with the county commissioners.

To the Honorable Board of County Commissioners, Franklin County, Ohio.

Gentlemen:- As directed by your Board on October 14, 1920, I have made a plat and survey for the proposed establishment of the Warner Road in Blendon and Plain Townships.

I herewith submit a list of the abutting property owners along the line of said road as proposed, the amount of land to be taken and the amount of rods of fencing required to be constructed.

I recommend that the said road be established forty (40) feet in width on the line as shown on the plat as submitted. The establishment of the road will necessitate the construction of a bridge of approximately thirty (30) foot span at some future time. The road will benefit a number of farms in securing a good permanent outlet.

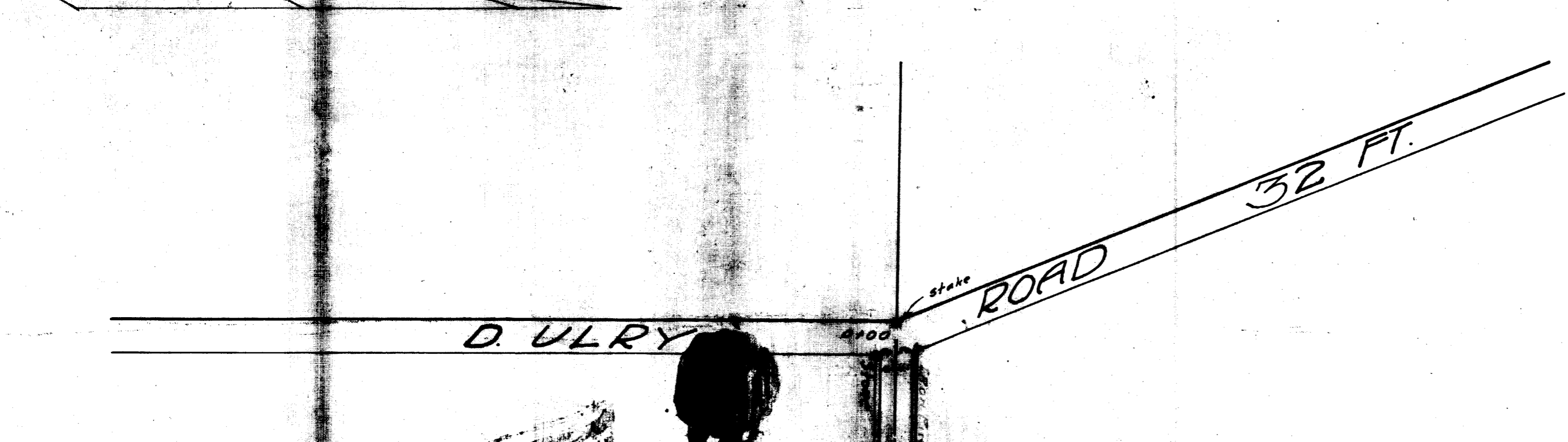

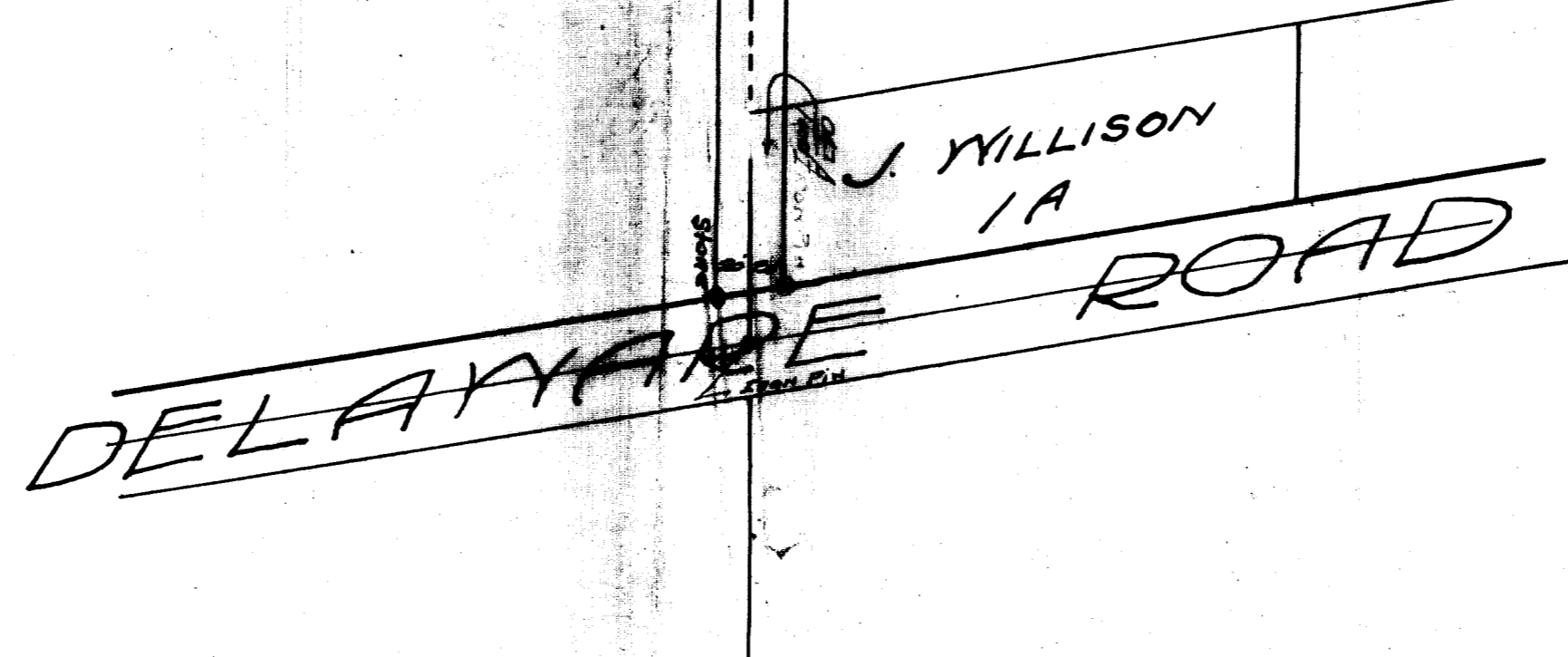

In the matter of the application of T. A. Warner and others for the establishment of a county road described therein, filed Sept. 15, 1920, Mr. Scott offered the following preamble and resolution, and moved the adoption of the same, which was duly seconded by Mr. Atcherson.

WHEREAS, On the 14th day of October, 1920, the board of county commissioners did, by resolution duly adopted, authorize and direct the surveyor of Franklin County, Ohio, to make report in writing to the Board on or before 10 A.M. of Saturday, November 6, 1920; said report to be in manner and form set forth and required by section 6865 General Code; and

WHEREAS, On November 6, 1920, H. D. Metcalf, Deputy County Surveyor, made report thereon in writing; and

WHEREAS, The Board of County Commissioners finds that the public utility and welfare require the establishment of said road on lines as set forth in the surveyor's report and plat submitted; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, By the Board of Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, that said road as shown on the surveyor's report and plat submitted be and the same is hereby found and declared to be of sufficient importance to cause the establishment of the same to the width of forty (40) feet; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the 30th day of November, 1920, at 10 o'clock A.M., be and the same is hereby fixed as the time and the office of the board of county commissioners, the place for hearing claims for compensation and damages, and that all claims for compensation and damages shall be filed with the board on or before time of said hearing; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That notice of such time and place of hearing such claims shall be served on the owner or owners personally or by leaving a copy of the same at the usual place of residence of such owner or owners, at least five days before the time fixed for said hearing, and that the clerk of the board shall cause such notice to be given and make due report thereon, as provided in section 6870 General Code.
