

This road record entry is a combination of the original road record book found in the Franklin County Engineer's Tax Map Department and the WPA transcribed road record book found in the Franklin County Engineer's Records Department. The WPA information was added to the original record to aid in reading the text or plats.

P E T I T I O N

To the County Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio:

The undersigned petitioners, freeholders of said County, residing in the vicinity of the proposed improvement hereinafter described, respectfully represent that the public convenience and welfare require the vacating of public alleys on the line hereinafter described; and make application to you to institute and order proper proceedings in the premises to vacate such alleys; the same not being an inter-county, highway or a main market road.

The following is the route and termini of said Alleys.

First Alley being 16.33 feet wide bounded on the south by lots 3, 4, 5 & 6, of Broadleigh East Subdivision, on the north by lots 78 & 44 of said subdivision, on the east by Audubon Road and on the west by Lowell Road.

Second Alley being 16.33 feet wide, bounded on the west by lots 77 & 78 of Broadleigh East Subdivision on the east by lot 44 of said Subdivision, on the north by Denver Avenue and on the south by the above first described alley.

P E T I T I O N E R ' S B O N D

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we, E J Schanfarber and Leon J Goodman are held and firmly bound unto the State of Ohio, for the use and benefit of Franklin County, in the penal sum of Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars, to the payment of which, well and truly to be made, we do hereby jointly and severally bind ourselves our heirs, executors and administrators.

Signed by us and dated at Columbus, Ohio, this --- day of ----, 1922.

The condition of the above obligation is such, that whereas, application by petition has been made to the County Commissioners of said Franklin County, by W J Darby and others for the vacating of public alleys, the following being the route and termini thereof:

First Alley being 16.33 feet wide, bounded on the south by lots 3, 4, 5 & 6, of Broadleigh East Subdivision, on the north by lots 78 & 44 of said Subdivision, on the east by Audubon Road and on the west by Lowell Road.

Second Alley being 16.33 feet wide, bounded on the west by lots 77 & 78 of Broadleigh East Subdivision, on the east by lot 44 of said Subdivision, on the north by Denver Avenue and on the south by the above first described alley.

Now, if the said petitioners will pay into the Treasury of said County, the costs and expenses incurred in the proceedings for such improvement, in case the prayer of such petition be not granted; then this obligation to be void, otherwise to be in full force in law.

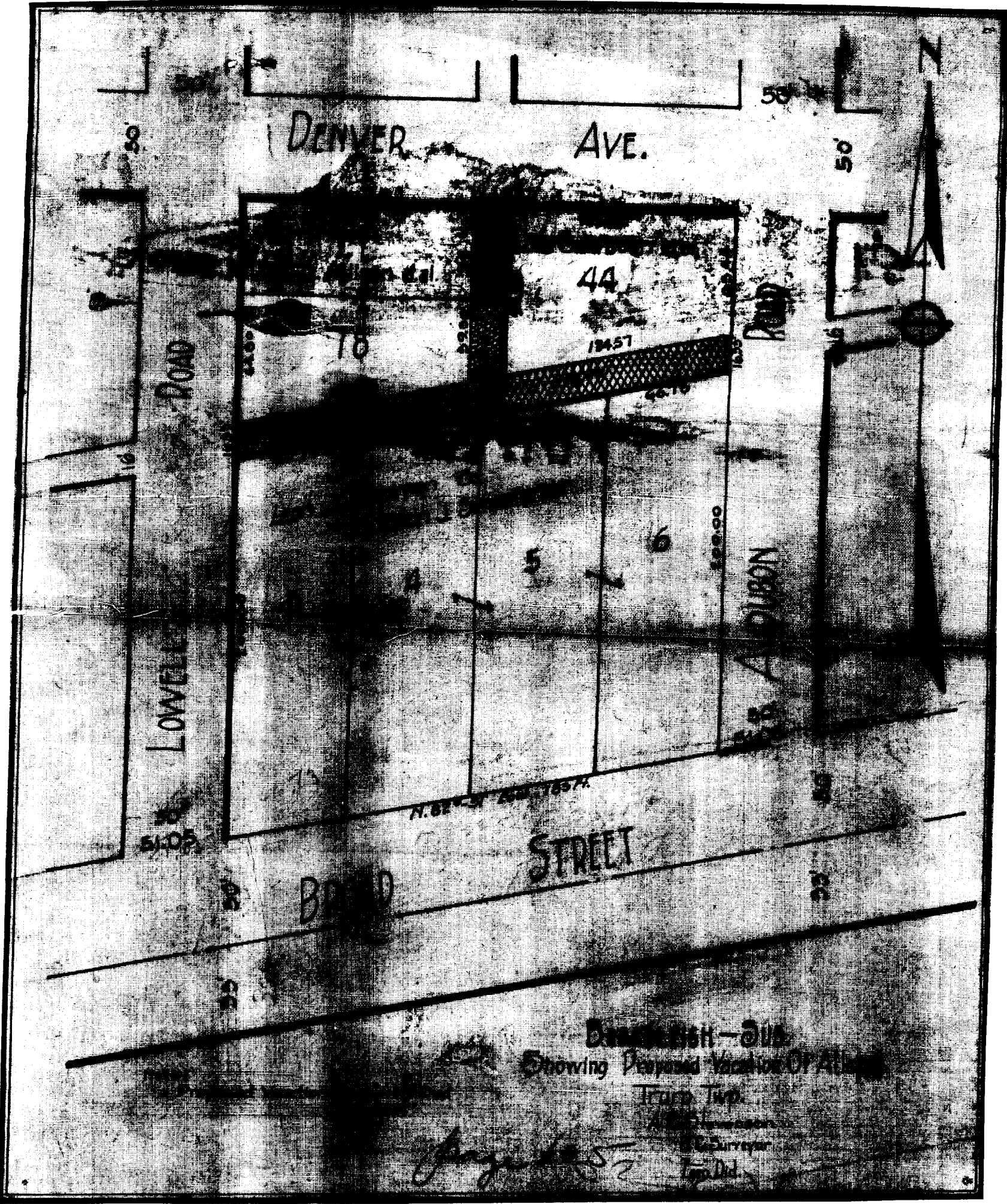

FRANKLIN CO. O., ROAD RECORD No. 13 BROADLEIGH EAST SUBDIVISION- VACATION OF ALLEYS.

WHEREAS, The Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, did on the 2nd day of January, 1923, the day fixed for the viewing of said proposed alley vacation, meet on the line of said alleys as described in the petition and heard all proof offered by any parties affected by said vacation and other persons competent to testify, and did go over and along the line of said alleys and by actual view of the same and the premises along and adjacent thereto which are to be affected thereby, does find that said vacation is of sufficient public importance to require that the county surveyor be instructed and directed to make a plat and survey of the same; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, By the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, that the county surveyor of Franklin County, Ohio, be and he hereby is directed and instructed to make a plat and survey of the proposed vacation and make report in writing to the Board of County Commissioners on or before the 17th day of January, 1923, at 10 o'clock A.M. Said report shall set forth the opinion of the county surveyor either for or against the granting of said proposed vacation, which report, together with the plat and survey of the improvement, shall be deposited with the county commissioners.

Gentlemen:- As ordered by your board on January 2, 1923, I have made a survey and plat of the alleys to be vacated in "Broadleigh East" Addition on petition to your board by W. J. Darby et al. on December 2, 1922.

I find that Leon J. Goodman and Edwin J. Schanfarber who own lots numbered 3, 4, 5 and 6 on the accompanying plat, have an agreement with H. M. Johnson and Harry Bowser, agents for Eva S. Allison et al. owners of "Broadleigh East" addition, for the purchase of lots numbered 77, 78 and 44, but said purchase is to be executed only when the alleys petitioned for are vacated, it being the desire of Goodman and Schanfarber to have the land all in one piece. Therefore, while it is of no public benefit to vacate these alleys, having once been dedicated to public use, yet it is no serious detriment to the welfare or convenience of the public to vacate them, so I am of the opinion that said alleys may be vacated provided that Leon C. Goodman and Edwin J. Schanfarber acquire lots numbered 77, 78 and 44.
