

This road record entry is a combination of the original road record book found in the Franklin County Engineer's Tax Map Department and the WPA transcribed road record book found in the Franklin County Engineer's Records Department. The WPA information was added to the original record to aid in reading the text or plats.

PUBLIC ROAD PETITION

Fairwood Avenue - from Refugee Road to Watkins Road

ROW = 50'

To the County Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio:

The undersigned petitioners, freeholders of said County, residing in the vicinity of the proposed improvement hereinafter described, respectfully represent that the public convenience and welfare require the establishing of a Public Road on the line hereinafter described; and make application to you to institute and order proper proceedings in the premises to establish such road; the same not being an inter-county, highway or a main market road.

The following is the route and termini of said road:

Beginning at "Begin on the center line of the English Road or Refuge Pike at the one-half section corner in the north line of section two (2) Township four (4) Marion Township and running thence south along said section line a distance of about one mile to the center of the A. Watkins Road--- there to terminate".

That we, O. G. Watkins and Royal Indemnity Co. are held and firmly bound unto the State of Ohio, for the use and benefit of Franklin County, in the penal sum of Two Hundred Dollars, to the payment of which, well and truly to be made, we do hereby jointly and severally bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and administrators.

Signed by us and dated at Columbus, this 1st. day of Aug. 1923.

The condition of the above obligation is such, that whereas, application by petition has been made to the County Commissioners of said Franklin County, by O. G. Watkins and others for the establishing of a Public Road; the following being the route and termini thereof; Beginning on the center line of the English Road or Refuge Pike at the one-half section corner in the north line of section (2) two, Township four (4) Marion Township, and running thence south along said section line, a distance of about one mile to the center of the A. Watkins Road there to terminate.

Now, if the said petitioners will pay into the Treasury of said County, the costs and expenses incurred in the proceedings for such improvement, in case the prayer of such petition be not granted; then this obligation to be void; otherwise to be in full force in law.

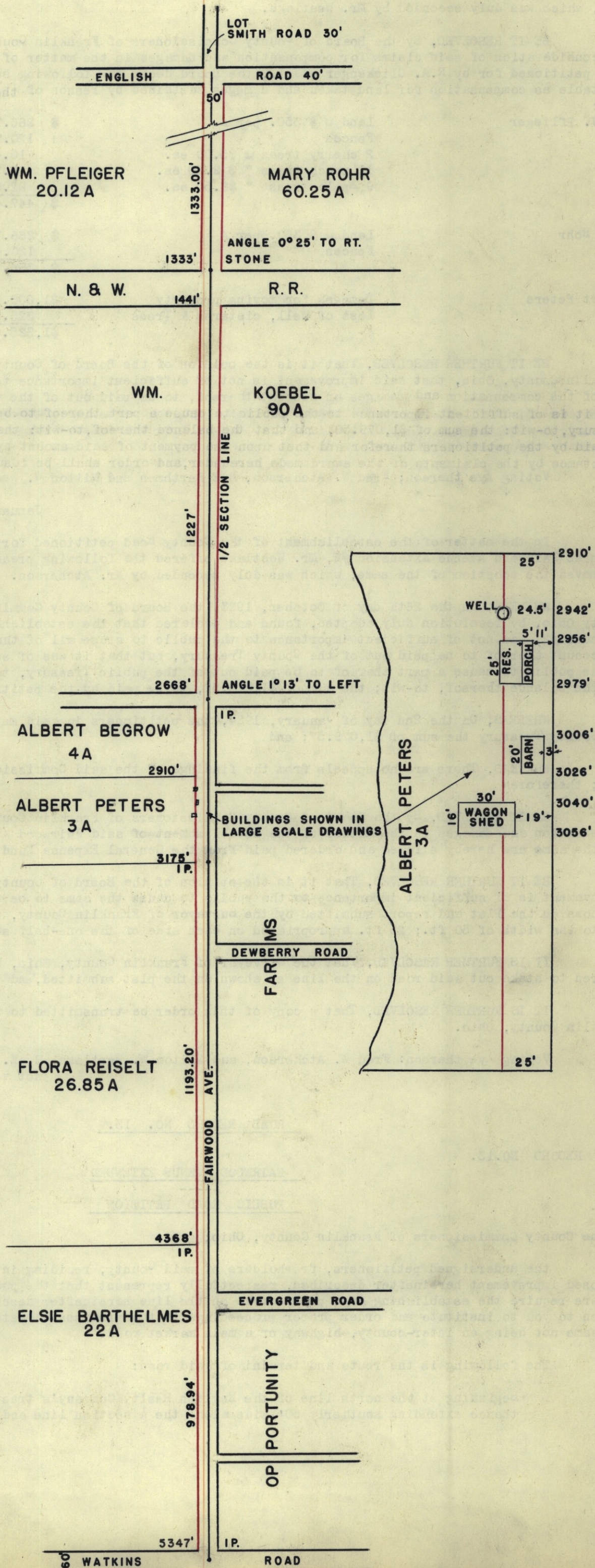

Fairwood Avenue Extended #2

In the matter of the petition of R. A. Clickenger et al. praying for the establishment of a county road, known as "Fairwood Avenue Extended No. 2", Mr. Barthman offered the following preamble and resolution and moved the adoption of the same, which was duly seconded by Mr. Westlake.

WHEREAS, On the 1st. day of August, 1923, R. A. Clickenger and others, filed with the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, a petition praying for the establishment of a county road in Marion Township, Franklin County, Ohio, described in said petition and being an extension of Fairwood Avenue; and

WHEREAS, On the 1st. day of August, 1923, said Board of County Commissioners did fix the 14th day of August, 1923, at 9 o'clock A. M. central standard time, on the line of said proposed road, as the time and place for the viewing of said proposed road and did further fix the 12th day of September, 1923, at 9 o'clock A. M. central standard time, at the office of the Board of County Commissioners as the time and place for final hearing on said petition; and

WHEREAS, Legal notice by publication in The Ohio State Journal, a newspaper published in and of general circulation in said county, was given of the time and place for the viewing of said location and of the final hearing thereon; and

WHEREAS, The Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, did on the 14th day of August, 1923, the day fixed for the viewing of said proposed road, did meet on the line thereof as described in the petition and heard all the proof offered by parties interested in and affected thereby and other persons competent to testify and did go over and along the line of said proposed road and by actual view of the same and the premises along and adjacent thereto, which are to be affected thereby, does find that said establishment is of sufficient importance to require that the surveyor of Franklin County, Ohio, be instructed and directed to make a survey and plat thereof; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, By the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, that the County Surveyor of Franklin County, Ohio, be, and he hereby is instructed and directed to make a plat and survey of the proposed road and make report to the Board of County Commissioners on or before the 12th day of September, 1923, at 9 A. M. central standard time. Said report shall set for the opinion of the county surveyor either for or against the granting of said proposed establishment, which report, together with the plat and survey of said improvement, shall be deposited with the county commissioners.

To the Honorable Board of County Commissioners,
Franklin County, Ohio.
Gentlemen:

As directed by your Board on August 28th, 1923, I have made a survey and plat of the extension of Fairwood Avenue, Marion Township, from the English Road to the Watkins Road, which I hereby submit, together with a list of property owners along the line of said road as proposed and the amount of land taken, also the number of rods and fencing required in fencing said road.

I would recommend that the said road be established to a width of fifty (50) feet, twenty-five feet (25) being appropriated each side of the one-half section line.

I would recommend that the road be established for the following reasons, viz:

It will afford an outlet for the several tracts of land abutting on said proposed road, whose only outlet at present is through privately owned lanes, which are a constant expense to the individuals maintaining same. It will also be of general public utility and convenience.

WHEREAS, On the 28th day of August, 1923, the Board of County Commissioners did, by resolution duly adopted, authorize and direct the Surveyor of Franklin County, Ohio, to make report in writing to the Board on or before 9 A. M., central standard time, of September 12, 1923; said report to be in manner and form set forth and required by Section 6865 General Code; and

WHEREAS, On the 12th day of September, 1923, R. S. Blackford, Deputy County Surveyor, made report thereon in writing; and

WHEREAS, on the 12th day of September, 1923, consideration of said report was postponed to September 22, 1923; and

WHEREAS, The Board of County Commissioners finds that the public utility and welfare require the establishment of said road on lines as set forth in surveyor's report and plat submitted; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, By the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, that said road as shown on plat submitted by the county surveyor be and the same is hereby found and declared to be of sufficient importance to cause the establishment of the same to the width of fifty (50) feet, twenty-five feet to be appropriated each side of the one-half section line; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the 12th day of October, 1923, at 9 o'clock A. M., central standard time, be and the same is hereby fixed as the time and the office of the Board of County Commissioners the place for hearing claims for compensation and damages, and that all claims for compensation and damages shall be filed with the Board on or before time of said hearing; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That notice of such time and place of hearing such claims shall be served on the owner or owners personally, or by leaving a copy of the same at the usual place of residence of such owner or owners, at least five days before the time fixed for such hearing, and that the clerk of the Board shall cause such notice to be given and make due report thereon, as provided in section 6870 General Code.

WHEREAS, On the 26th day of October, 1923, the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, by resolution duly adopted, found and declared that the establishment of Fairwood Avenue Extended #2, was not of sufficient importance to the public to cause all of the compensation and damages on account thereof to be paid out of the County Treasury, but that it was of sufficient importance to the public to cause a part thereof to be paid out of the public treasury, to-wit, the sum of \$1079.58, and the balance thereof, to-wit, the sum of \$1079.57, to be paid by the petitioners therefor; and

WHEREAS, On the 2nd. day of January, 1924, the petitioners in said matter did certify into the County Treasury the sum of \$1079.57; and

WHEREAS, There are no appeals from the findings of the said Commissioners pending at this time; therefore

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Surveyor of Franklin County, Ohio, be and he is hereby ordered to stake out said road on the line as shown on the plat submitted, and to the width of 50 ft.; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that a copy of this order be transmitted to the said Surveyor of Franklin County, Ohio.
