

This road record entry is a combination of the original road record book found in the Franklin County Engineer's Tax Map Department and the WPA transcribed road record book found in the Franklin County Engineer's Records Department. The WPA information was added to the original record to aid in reading the text or plats.

Vacation of three alleys in the Haag Addition Subdivision

## PUBLIC ROAD PETITION

To the County Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio.

The undersigned petitioners, freeholders of said County, residing in the vicinity of the proposed improvement hereinafter described, respectfully represent that the public convenience and welfare require the vacation of public alleys on the line hereinafter described; and make application to you to institute and order proper proceedings in the premises to vacate such alleys the same not being an intercounty highway or a main market road.

The following is the route and termini of said alleys;

Vacation of the following alleys in the Haag Addition in Marion Township, Franklin County, Ohio, viz:

1st. The 20 foot alley running east and west between Moler Street and Sheldon Avenue and extending from the west line of said addition to the alley west of Wilson Avenue, and being about 65.56 feet in length.

2nd. The 20 foot alley running east and west between Sheldon Avenue and Jenkins Avenue and extending from the west line of said addition to the alley west of Wilson Avenue, and being about 67.46 feet in length.

3rd. The 20 foot alley running east and west between Jenkins and Southwood Avenue and extending from the west line of said addition to the alley west of Wilson Avenue, and being about 69.22 feet in length,

1st. The 20 foot alley running east and west between Moler Street and Sheldon Avenue and extending from the west line of said addition to the alley west of Wilson Avenue, and being about 65 56 feet in length.

2nd. The 20 foot alley running east and west between Sheldon Avenue and Jenkins Avenue and extending from the west line of said addition to the alley west of Wilson Avenue, and being about 67.46 feet in length.

3rd. The 20 foot alley running east and west between Jenkins Avenue and Southwood Ave. and extending from the west line of said addition to the alley west of Wilson Avenue and being about 69.22 feet in length.

Now, if the said petitioners will pay into the treasury of said county the costs and expenses incurred in the proceedings for such improvement, in case the prayer of such petition be not granted; then this obligation to be void, otherwise to be in full force in law.

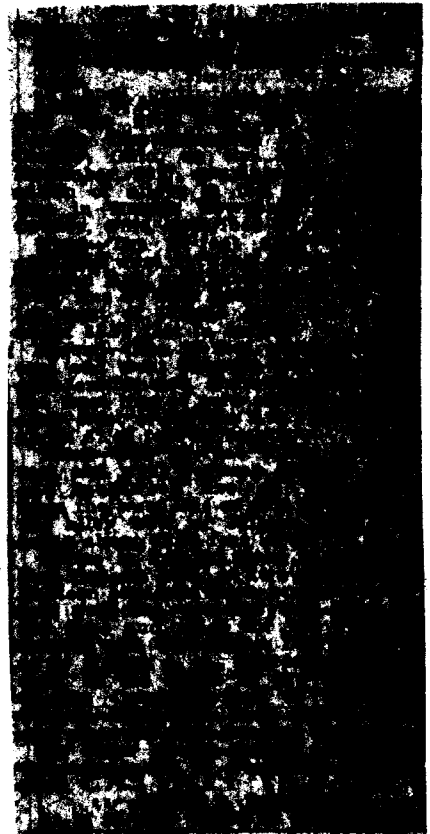

WHEREAS, on the 17th day of November, 1927, J L Eichner, et al filed with the board of county commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, a petition praying for the vacation of alleys in Haag Addition, described in said petition; and

WHEREAS, On the 19th day of November, 1927, said board of county commissioners did fix the 13th day of December, 1927, at ten oclock A.M. eastern standard time, on the line of said alleys proposed to be vacated, as the time and place for the viewing thereof, and did further fix the 21st day of December, 1927, at ten oclock A.M. eastern standard time, at the office of the board of county commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, as the time and place for final hearing thereon; and

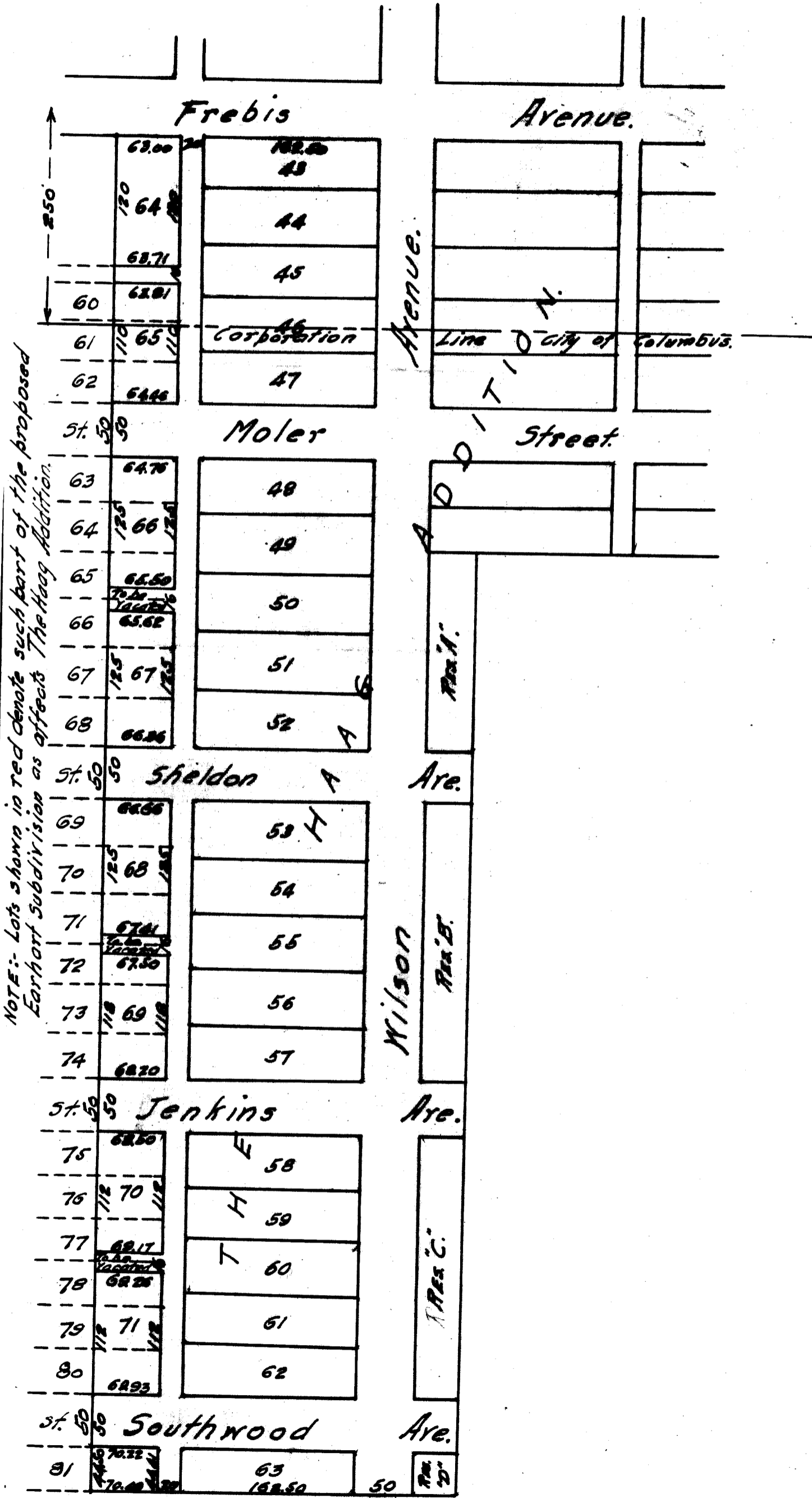

Therefore, I would recommend that said alleys be vacated as prayed for in the petition, and for the reason above given.

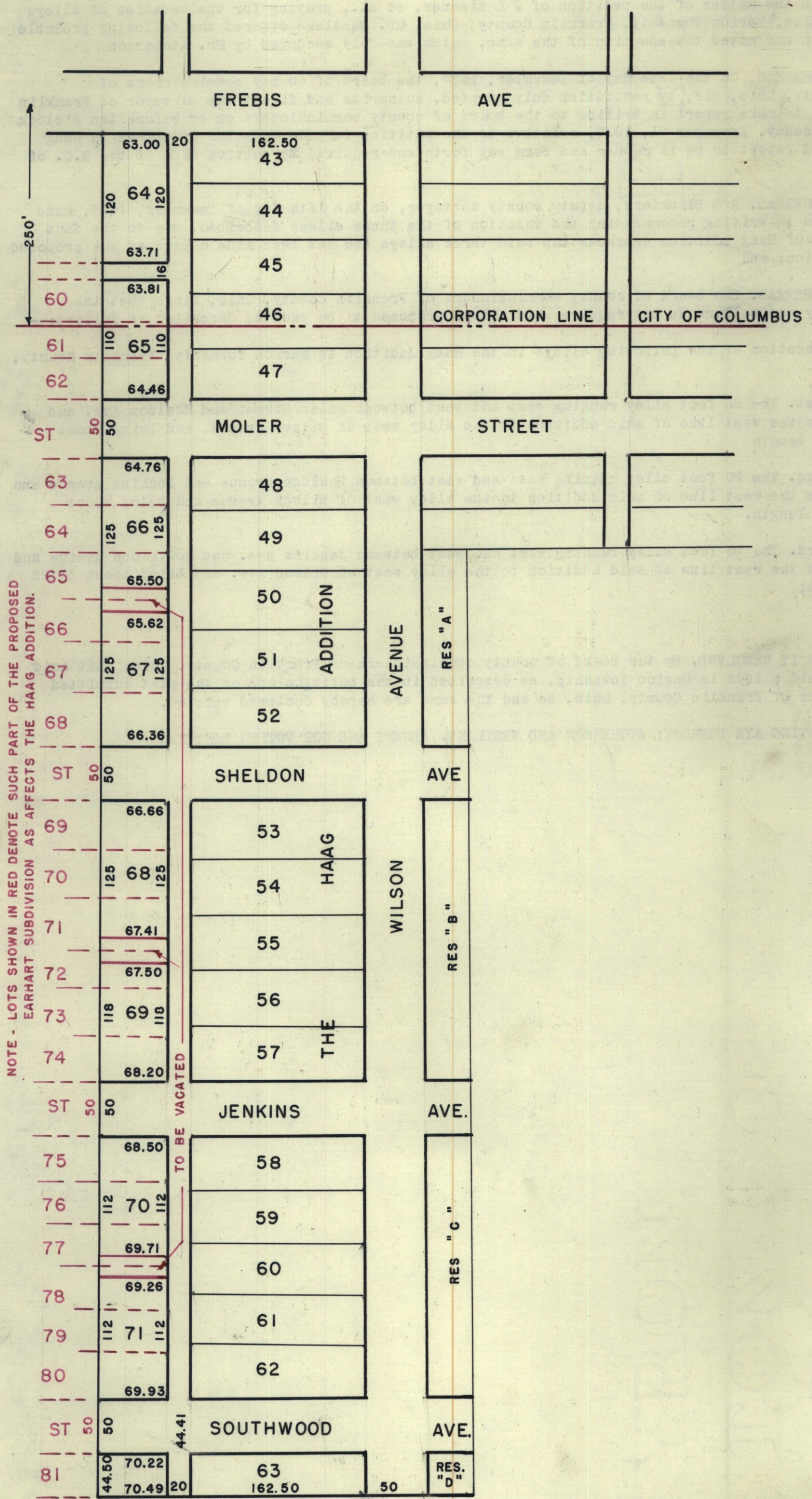

In the matter of the petition of J L Eichner, et al., praying for the vacation of alleys in Haag Addition, Marion Township, Franklin County, Ohio, Mr. Westlake offered the following preamble and resolution and moved the adoption of the same, which was duly seconded by Mr. Atcherson

X WHEREAS, On the 13th day of December, 1927, the board of county commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, did, by resolution duly adopted, authorize and direct the surveyor of Franklin County, Ohio, to make report in writing to the board of county commissioners on or before ten o'clock A.M. of Wednesday, December 21, 1927, relative to the petition for the vacation of alleys in Haag Addition; said report to be in manner and form set forth and required by section 6865 of the G. C. of Ohio; and

WHEREAS, R S Blackford, deputy county surveyor, on the 16th day of December, 1927, made report thereon in writing recommending the vacation of the three alleys described, due to the fact that new plat of Haag Addition embraces the said three alleys and has been made a part of the proposed new sub-division; and

WHEREAS, The board of county commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, finds that the public utility and welfare do not require said alleys proposed to be vacated described as follows:--

Vacation of the following alleys in the Haag Addition in Marion Township, Franklin County, Ohio, viz:

1st. The 20 foot alley running east and west between Moler Street and Sheldon Ave. and extending from the west line of said addition to the alley west of Wilson Avenue, and being about 65.56 feet in length.

2nd. The 20 foot alley running east and west between Sheldon Avenue and Jenkins Avenue and extending from the west line of said addition to the alley west of Wilson Ave. and being about 67.46 feet in length.
