Trabue Road Over Scioto River & Over Scioto Pointe Drive Improvement Project

[Columbus, Ohio – March 1, 2023] – Cornell R. Robertson, P.E., P.S., Franklin County Engineer, announces that a public meeting will be held on Wednesday, March 15, 2023, to discuss the Trabue Road Over Scioto River & Over Scioto Pointe Drive Improvement project (FRA-CR27-10.77 & 10.89 PID: 105759).

The Franklin County Engineer's Office intends to improve a portion of Trabue Road by rehabilitating two bridges: over the Scioto River and over Scioto Pointe Drive. The project will also provide a sidewalk on the south side of Trabue Road and a shared-use path on the north side.



A public meeting will be held on Wednesday, March 15, 2023, at 5:00 p.m. at the Franklin County Engineer's Office located at 970 Dublin Road, Columbus, Ohio 43215. The public meeting will utilize an open house format with a formal presentation to begin at 5:30 p.m. Personnel representing the Franklin County Engineer's Office will be available to discuss the proposed improvements. Following the presentation, a question and answer session will be held.
