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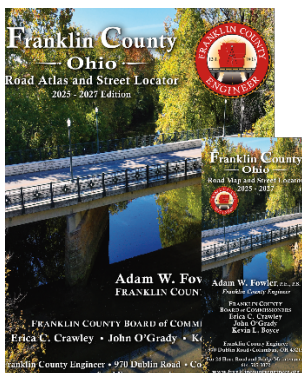
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## Navigating Growth: The 2025 Franklin County Map and Atlas

Updating our printed maps and atlases is not only a requirement under the Ohio Revised Code, it's a longstanding commitment to transparency, accessibility, and service. The Franklin County Engineer's Office takes pride in delivering a reliable and easy-to-use guide that helps residents, businesses, public agencies, and the traveling public navigate our growing and evolving region.

This year's map features a bridge project that holds special significance to Engineer Fowler. It is a structure he helped deliver during his time as a Project Engineer. Its inclusion highlights not only the County's ongoing investment in infrastructure, but also the continuity of leadership committed to improving the region's roads, bridges, and transportation systems.

2025 Franklin County Map & Atlas

The map and atlas continue to serve as essential references for the State, County, and Township Highway Systems, as well as all public roads within cities and villages across Franklin County. This edition includes over 60 new public roads, bringing the total to more than 13,000. Freeway interchanges and major intersections have been updated to reflect recent construction. Additionally, 300 private streets have been added to the comprehensive atlas index, the only printed resource for this level of detail. Updates also include new points of interest, expanded multi-use paths, and the addition of Bank Run and Great Southern Metro Parks.

Engineer Fowler has made these printed maps and atlases available for free, through public libraries, the Bureau of Motor Vehicles licensing agencies, and various city, state, county, and township offices within Franklin County. The maps and atlas are also available all hours, every day, through convenient pick-up boxes located outside the Engineer's Main Office, 970 Dublin Road, Columbus, Ohio, 43215; Engineer's East Outpost, 4801 Hendron Road, Groveport, Ohio 43125; and Engineer's West Outpost, 4444 Fisher Road, Columbus, Ohio 43228.
